#### AQG Guild Meeting Minutes April 9, 2018

The Guild meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Judy Stewart.

**Minutes:** Marilyn Wheeler moved to approve the March minutes as published and Susi Olson seconded the motion. The vote was passed to accept minutes as published.

**Treasure's Report:** Treasurer Mary Jane Beard provided a printed report regarding March's finances to all members for review. Income: \$ 1,555.75 (\$745.00 AWOL, \$150.00 membership, \$ 5.00 newsletter, \$44.00 fundraising, \$610.00 workshop {\$450.00 March and \$160.00 June}, \$1.75 interest). Expenses: \$ 4,979.72 (\$4,208.38 AWOL {\$3,777.75

spring and \$430.63 fall deposit}, \$42.42 fundraising, \$37.92 newsletter, \$300.00 programs, \$391.00 workshop {\$325.00 March and \$66.00 June).

There have been some revisions to treasure report(s). Treasure report has been posted on-line.

The CD of \$10,000 matures on 4/15/18 and Sarah CD matures 9/10/18. There was discussion at the last board meeting regarding moving some money from checking into the CD that matures in April. The board voted and decided that the CD that is currently \$10,000 be reinvested when it matures on 4/15/18 with an additional \$5,000 from the checking account making the CD total \$15,000. This will be reinvested by the end of the month.

### **Committee Reports:**

AWOL: Leah Sample, Eddie and Melissa Landreth, Jim Gatling, Sally Burrup, Chairs. Leah Sample thanked everyone that participated in the Spring AWOL held at C. A. Vines Arkansas 4-H center in Ferndale on March 16-18, 2018. They were able to 'break even.' The food at the 4-H center was better than experienced at the last event held last fall. They will chair the Fall AWOL that will be held at C. A. Vines Arkansas 4-H center in Ferndale on October 12-14, 2018. Registration will begin in May. They will be asking for donations for door prizes for the upcoming Fall AWOL. Judy Stewart also took the time to thank the committee for their generosity. There were many great door prizes donated from the committee.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday sit and sew will be held April 21, 2018. Leah Sample will not be there but the room will be open. Be sure to arrive by noon if you plan to attend.

**Challenges: Sherri Dodds, Chair.** Sherri is collecting 'ugly fat quarters' for the upcoming challenge. She encouraged everyone to bring 100% cotton 'ugly fat quarters' in order to participate. Members can bring 'ugly fat quarters' in May as well in order to participate in the challenge. Members will 'exchange' an ugly fat quarter and create an 11 ½ " unfinished *disappearing ugly block* which will be due in June. She reminded everyone that a fat quarter measures 18" x 22". Further details regarding this challenge will be on the AQG website and in the newsletter.

**Community Service: Meg Cullum, Chair** shared that she will be collecting quilts to be donated to Brookdale, a senior living community in Conway. There are over 80 residents that are wheelchair bound. Therefore lap size quilts will be needed. Quilt sizes range from 36x36 to 50x50. Population of the senior living community consists of women, men, and some veterans. She has about 8-10 precut quilt kits with her tonight, first come first served. She is asking for fabric donations of background fabric such as white, off white, tan, cream, grey colored fabric. She plans to utilize background fabric with the quilt kits. A community service project link can be found on the AQG website. Links to free patterns for those that want to donate a quilt utilizing charm squares or fat quarters can be found on the AQG website as well. Several quilts have been donated thus far. Anyone that donates will be given a ticket, and there will be a drawing at the end of the year for a prize. Any remaining donation quilts from juvenile fabric unsuitable for an adult are welcome and can be donated to The Call foster care program.

**Fundraising:** Chair needed. Judy Stewart shared to contact her if anyone was interested in purchasing a name tag. Sherry Williams, membership chair will also be collecting money for name tags which are \$12.00 each. License plates with AQG logo are also available to purchase.

#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

The program was provided by Carol Hurt and April Layher. Carol started our program but sharing that she had outlined her ideas in a document on her PC and lost all her notes with a new PC! She also shared "Ode to My Wife, the Quilter" a hilarious poem about how much we can neglect when quilting captures our interest. It was something we could all relate to. Carol's mother and grandmother were quilters and used whatever fabric they had available. Carol's first quilt was made using strips from a tablecloth. Her mother handquilted it using the popular Baptist Fan design.

The first quilt she completed by herself was done during the years 1994 – 1997. It was pieced houses and the back of the quilt was stunning.

Carol's daughter got married and was fond of the country-looking styles of the time and Carol made her a quilt of pieced hearts. She started handquilting it. Three months into the project, her daughter changed her mind about the quilt. AND, Carol got a longarm of her own. Carol had the quilt half done with hand-quilting and un-quilted it in order to complete the whole thing on her longarm! It is custom quilted and a real beauty. Carol has been involved with the Nature Center quilting projects sponsored by the Nature Center in Pine Bluff. She showed us a sampler quilt with a custom designed block with a purple Iris flower. Judy Tipton-Rush designed the block originally for a wall hanging for Carol's sister Iris. It turned out so pretty that she incorporated it into the sampler quilt. One of the quilts was for a recipe fund-raiser. Each block in the quilt represents a recipe.

Carol also showed other projects that were a quilt-as-you-go, another sampler she made using applique techniques, a log cabin quilt in bright colors.

She then showed a quilt made with a Twister tool and yelled out, "Hey, Sue! This is what a Twister is supposed to look like!". Evidently, Sue Womack's quilt didn't end up as desired.....

Carol showed a quilt that she completed after a guild-sponsored Donna Lynn Thomas workshop last year. It was beautiful! She said the most fun part of this project was choosing all the colors to use in the quilt.

For a different technique, Carol used her fabric stash to cover a sweatshirt and make an attractive jacket. There were many oohs and aahs while she was exclaiming, "NEVER AGAIN!"

Her final items were Monrovian bells. These are made from fabric-covered card stock. Carol showed several different motifs from simple to fancy and then fancier. She also brought some samples that she had made from Christmas cards. They were all darling and could be used on wreaths or Christmas trees.

Our program then continued with April Layher showing quilts that she has made over the years. April is a California girl whose grandfather lived in Amish country. Summer trips to visit him brought about her interest in quilting.

April and her husband have a combined family of 6 children, 6 foster girls from Ghana, and 24 grandchildren. April has given away most of her quilts but still had several stunners to show us.

Her first item was a quilt block that her grandma made that she has framed and on display in her sewing room. An early quilt was made using squares from clothes. As expected, there were many types of fabric incorporated in the quilt, including polyester!

She then showed a quilt made by her Aunt Polly that is a Grandmother's Flower Garden made with small hexagon pieces – all cut, sewn, and quilted by hand. It is exquisite.

April's 1<sup>st</sup> quilt is called her Louisiana Hurricane Quilt. It was made from fabric scraps and she cut all the pieces using templates she made herself – during a hurricane in Louisiana.

April's career was as a Biologist for the AR Game and Fish. She was in charge of programs at the Nature Center in Pine Bluff and for her first program decided to do a block of the month. She even provided the fabric to the participants!

The second program was called A Trip Down the Arkansas River. Both quilts were darling and had examples of flowers, plants and wildlife.

The next quilt was done while April was quilting with the Girl Gang at the old Blossom's shop. It was a Jan Patek pattern in primitive plique. April indicated that the process was stressful at times. The quilt turned out beautifully and she calls it Sunshine on My Shoulders. It is all needle-turn applique and she used very different colors from the usual Jan Patek designs. Debbie Haley quilted the quilt.

April showed a darling Halloween quilt from a pattern by Blackbird Designs. It incorporated her favorite color of purple and used both piecing and applique in the quilt.

April also does wool applique.

April finished her presentation with a lovely tribute to our late guild member, Geannine Ott. Geannine was a champion in the quilting world. April indicated that Geannine provided much inspiration for her forage into applique. She was an inspiration for us all!

Thank you Carol and April for a wonderful program!

Precut quilt kits will be available at guild meetings. Some free patterns have been posted on the guild website on the community service page. Quilts should be between 36 and 55 inches square (it is okay if they are slightly larger on the long side of a rectangular quilt).

We need your help! If you would like to de-stash your fabric, community service is currently in need of neutral fabrics to use in kit making. Fabrics should be white, beige/ tan/cream, gray, or black. They can be solids, prints or batiks. We take as small as a fat quarter or several yards if you have it.


