AQG Guild Meeting Minutes October 8, 2018

The Guild meeting was called to order at 6:34 pm by President Judy Stewart. Judy thanked Vice President Sherry Williams for covering in her absence.

Minutes: Marilyn Wheeler moved to approve the September minutes as published and Carrie Weindorf seconded the motion. The vote was passed to accept minutes as published.

Treasure's Report: Treasurer Mary Jane Beard provided report regarding September's finances.

She also shared that income reflects AWOL and the upcoming bus tour in May 2019. Expenses included the webpage. Treasure report including details has been posted on-line.

Committee Reports:

AWOL: Leah Sample, Eddie and Melissa Landreth, Jim Gatling, Sally Burrup, Chairs.

Leah Sample announced fall AWOL will be held at C. A. Vines Arkansas 4-H center in Ferndale this coming weekend, October 12-14, 2018. This will be a lot of fun to work on projects and meet new people! Total of 25 attendees have registered. However, one that registered can not attend, please see Leah tonight if interested in

attending in this attendee's spot (first come first serve basis).

Challenges: Sherri Dodds, Chair. Sherri Dodds discussed the upcoming challenge, scary block challenge. Sherri will be collecting orphan blocks for this challenge, and she extended the due date- will be due in December. The goal is to create a 36x36 donation quilt utilizing the orphan blocks. See Sherri for details, and this will also be posted on the AQG website and in the newsletter. Participants will be entered for a prize basket.

Community Service: Meg Cullum, Chair shared that she will be collecting quilts to be donated to Brookdale, a senior living community in Conway. There are over 80 residents that are wheelchair bound. Therefore lap size guilts will be needed. Quilt sizes range from 36x36 to 50x50. Population of the senior living community consists of women, men, and some veterans. A community service project link can be found on the AQG website. Links to free patterns for those that want to donate a quilt can be found on the AQG website as well. A member's mother-in law donated 19 hand-pieced quilt tops in August. Meg asked for members to volunteer to help quilt these quilt tops, and there are still a few tops that need to be quilted. There should be enough fabric to supply the backing, but the quilter would need to supply the batting. She will also need future volunteers to help bind as well. Please see Meg if you can volunteer to help. She anticipates that all residents will receive a donation quilt, and she thanked everyone that has donated thus far. Anyone that donates will be given a ticket, and there will be a drawing at the end of the year for a prize. She also announced that there are plans for donating to a women/children's shelter in the future.

Any remaining donation quilts from juvenile fabric unsuitable for an adult are welcome and can be donated to The Call foster care program.

Fundraising: Chair needed. Sherry Williams shared to contact her if anyone was interested in purchasing a name tag. She will also be collecting money for name tags which are \$12.00 each.

Hostess: Cynthia Quick and Meg Cullum, Chairs. Meg Cullum shared that there were 60 members present this evening. She announced an upcoming event: Q.U.I.L.T Guild of NWA will host a show on April 5-6, 2019 in Springdale, AR.

Program tonight: 'Quilt Around.' There will be 5 demos hosted by guild members. Groups will visit each demo and learn new tools, tips, or techniques. Everyone will get a fat quarter which will designate your group. Demos tonight includes: 1) Cindy Barszczewski, gadgets; 2) Sue Womack, easy projects; 3) Jackie Bibbs, two color flange binding; 4) Leah Sample, binding techniques, 5) Karen Alexander, paper piecing. Thanks to all these members for volunteering their time and sharing new ideas, tips, and/or techniques!

We will have our Christmas party in December. Cindy reminded everyone to bring a potluck dish in December. Cindy also reminded everyone that anyone or any group can donate a gift.

Judy Bowers will give a program in November, and there is a schedule change. The community center will be closed on Monday 11/12/18 for observance of Veteran's day, therefore the meeting will be held on Monday 11/5/18.

Sue Womack shared that Judy Bowers will teach a Judy Niemeyer workshop in November, a poinsettia table topper size. This workshop is full. This will be held at the Baptist Health Southwest campus, and there will be a potluck.

Sue Womack also shared that the Missouri Star Bus tour trip has been confirmed for May 6-8, 2019. The cost for the trip will be \$250.00 per individual. Program Notes October 2017 Program Quilt Around Quilting Tips and Tools

One of the main reasons to belong to a guild is to be able to learn from each other. We sure got a lot of learning in during the October program.

Five members shared techniques and tools that might be new to some of us or were a good reminder of nifty ways to do things. They set up shop in five spaces, each with a different color fat quarter above their station. Each member was given a fat quarter and instructed to go to the corresponding color to begin our journey around the room. After several minutes, what sounded like a submarine's DIVE alarm went off, and each group moved to the next station.

Jackie Bibbs demonstrated the two-color flange binding technique, a different way to machine stitch binding to the front of a quilt.

Cindy Barszczewski showed lots of tempting gadgets, including the Quilters Select cutting

pad, rotary cutter, and ruler, as well as the Quilters Slidelock Ruler and the BlocLoc ruler with a channel, which is good for trimming. Her wool pressing mat is another must-have. Other products included Joen Wolfrom's 3-in-1 Color Tool, a Tailor Mate seam ripper, Roxanne's Dip and Dab glue, and Terial Magic Fabric Spray, as well as a scarf holder to keep strips separated, a pincushion on Velcro to stick to a design wall, a letter holder for rulers, a "retreat box" with slots for fabric and envelopes for rulers, and a magnetic mini-mat and ruler she found at Tuesday Morning.

Sue Womack showed several Christmas gifts: a mug rug, coasters, a hot pad, self-mitering fabric borders and frames, a pull-string bag, a lotus bag, and a way to decorate a jar with homemade goodies.

Karen Armstrong demonstrated foundation paper piecing.

Leah Sample showed how to use Elmer's washable school glue to piece together binding strips on the diagonal and then join them when they come together. Check out Sharon Schamber's Perfect Straight Binding on You Tube.

Quite an educational evening, presented by our very own members!


