

General class information: *The workshops are held in a horse barn (for anyone with allergies there will be hay, horses, and dust). The floor is sand, so we recommend you bring a comfy chair for yourself and a crate and mat for your companion. Our horses in residence are comfortable in just about any weather. We humans, however, might get chilled or hot so please dress appropriately for the temperature.*

Attendees will be bringing their own animals to the class. For you and your pet's safety we ask that all pets be properly restrained with leashes, carriers or crates. We usually enjoy a variety of animals at our workshops, such as

dogs, cats, horses, birds and rabbits, so now is your chance to truly talk with the animals! Participants are encouraged to bring water and snacks for themselves and their pets.

Recording devices are prohibited to protect the confidentiality of participants. Participants are also encouraged to wear insect repellent. Those pesky flies are also pretty fierce! There is a limit of one animal per participant so that everyone has ample opportunity to relax, learn and enjoy.

Payment and cancellation policy: *Payment in full is due at the time of registration. We accept*

cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. Cancellation policy—full refund if notified of cancellation at least 30 days prior to the workshop. Registration will be 50% refunded for cancellations of less than 30 days but more than 10 days prior to the workshop. There is no refund for cancellations less than 10 days prior to the workshop. Signed copy of the Hold Harmless Agreement must be received 10 days prior to workshop. Hold Harmless Agreements and registrations may be remitted by fax (please call to arrange fax services) or mail.

Workshop Facilitator: *Mary Clouse is a healer and intuitive from central Indiana.*

She has worked with professional racehorse trainers, veterinarians and owners in helping them understand their animals. She has assisted trainers in determining the causes of behavior and performance problems, guided owners in finding lost pets, worked with law enforcement officials on crime cases, aided owners and veterinarians in pinpointing health problems in all types of animals, facilitated emotional healing in animals and their human companions and provided messages from deceased pets to grieving owners. Mary has spent her adult life in the company of animals and currently shares a small farm with her human and assorted four-legged family.
