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UACT ELECTION RESULTS & MORE



At the May 4, 2015 Rep Council meeting, candidates for Vice President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Communications Secretary were announced. *"In the event that only one nominee is presented for an office, the question of waiving the ballot shall be immediately placed before the caucus on a non-debatable basis."* The Representatives voted to waive the ballot and the following officers were elected: Randy Smith (Sequoia) Vice President; Tammy Edwards (Maple) Treasurer; Linda Legman (Cypress) Recording Secretary; Karla Stevenson (Sequoia) Communications Secretary.

The Rep Council also voted to pilot a program for electronic voting. UACT will share a program with Las Virgenes Educators Association to conduct elections via email. Email will only be sent to home email addresses. Those addresses will not be shared with any other entity. If a member chooses not to share the personal email address, they will have to vote at the UACT office during a designated time. After one year, we will evaluate the program.

State Budget: Governor Brown released his May Revise of the budget. While the budget is still being analyzed, there is definitely more funding for schools. CTA's budget specialist, Angela Su, will be sending us her analysis soon. Stay tuned. We may be needing your assistance with phone calls to our representatives to keep the budget on track.

TEN SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR CTA SUMMER INSTITUTE AT UCLA AUGUST 2-4 OR 4-6

Each summer CTA presents its premier training workshop on the campus of UCLA. The Instructional and Professional Development (IPD) will offer an opportunity to attend a 2 1/2 day institute focusing on *Student-Centered professionals for the 21st Century and Beyond*. Workshop electives will integrate instructional strategies that center around technology and grade level content, and create partnerships leading the way for educator-led professional development. The keynote speakers this year are Gwyneth Jones and KNP Communications. Gwyneth is internationally honored and her writings have been featured in the New York Times, Washington Post, and Huffington Post. The KNP co-founders, John Neffinger and Matthew Kohut are the authors of *Compelling People: The Hidden Qualities the Make Us Influential and Connect, Then Lead*.

UACT will pay for tuition, room, and meals if you choose to stay on campus. If you choose to commute, you will receive a stipend for gas. We will help arrange carpools.
