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UACT AND DISTRICT AT ODDS ON BUDGETING

UACT entered into negotiations for this school year (2014/15) in December. Typically, we would have been negotiating for months by the time we reached December, but UACT made an agreement that we would hold off until after the November election. This would give us all the needed time for the passage of the bond. To be clear, the money for the bond cannot be used for salaries. It can only be used for the items delineated in the bond proposal.

The items being discussed at negotiations are:

- Evaluation
- Peer Assistance and Review (PAR)
- Class Size
- Work Day (meetings)
- Salary

Negotiations to date have been productive and we have accomplished quite a bit. There has been a difference of opinion about the health of the district's budget. The district creates a budget in July and then amends it throughout the year. In December, it was amended. In this version of the budget, there is no money set aside for raises for employees. What is set aside is every dollar of the increased funding from the state (\$8.6 million) to pay for items other than employees. UACT has taken issue with these numbers.

Our position is:

- a) There has never been an increase in spending on items other than employees like this;
- b) It speaks volumes that employees were not considered a high enough priority to budget an increase (just to keep up with inflation). The district did make a salary increase offer of 1% and we have been told there is another offer.

We have two future negotiations dates: February 5 and 25. We will update you as negotiations progress.

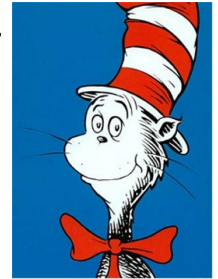

Congress Extends Educator Tax Deduction—For Now

The Senate passed the House-approved bill that extends the \$250 tax deduction for educators who purchase classroom supplies and instructional materials. The good news is that educators will be able to take the deduction in 2014. The bad news is the measure expires on December 31, and Congress will have to debate the issue again to renew the deduction for 2015 and beyond.

Educators across the country are [speaking out](#) on the importance of this tax deduction, which helps offset the collective \$1.6 billion that educators spend over the course of a school year, according to the most recent data of the National School Supply and Equipment Association.

Lawmakers on both sides of the aisle care about this issue, too. The educator tax deduction was instituted in 2002 in recognition of educators' generosity, and has had bipartisan support. In the House, Rep. David Reichert (R-WA) has introduced the Teacher Tax Relief Act of 2014 (H.R. 5504), which would make permanent the educator tax deduction for qualified expenses and expand it to include some professional development expenses.

Reichert and the bill's four other sponsors (Jim McDermott (D-WA), Aaron Schock (R-IL), Pat Tiberi (R-OH), and Bill Pascrell (D-NJ)) said in a statement: "Too often teachers spend their own hard-earned money in order to provide their students with basic school supplies. Our bill will alleviate some of the financial burden placed on today's teachers while also making a significant investment in the education and the futures of America's children."

2. All delegates will be expected to attend in person one of the two forms of assembly. Normally, this can be regarded as a duty. It is noted that the registration with the California delegation to participate in the general delegate assembly is the responsibility of the delegate.
3. Each delegate should attend all business meetings of the RA.
4. Each delegate should attend and vote on the RA budget committee hearings, resolutions committees meetings, and committee hearings, speeches, and prominent national figures.
5. Each delegate should also take into consideration CTE and Council on California Education when voting.
6. Each delegate is encouraged to participate actively in the work of the California delegation.
7. Each delegate should also be responsible for participating in all activities of the Service Center Council of his or her district. RA financials from the appropriate person should be provided will be shared. This is to ensure communication regarding business and personal emergency information of delegates to the delegate assembly.
8. Each delegate should ensure that they attend the RA assembly.
