That is where a time of response and this blog comes in.

Times of worship work very well as worship is simply one way for us to respond to God; with this however, we want students to make a concrete decision, commit to it, and seek accountability to make it happen. We want students to share WHAT they are choosing to abandon in order to pursue a more intimate relationship with God.

We are not phrasing this in "commitment" terminology, but rather "response" terminology. While people may falter in their commitments, God's works of Grace and Love in our lives will always encourage a response.

What that looks like depends on the student.
