# Chase's Mill Has a New Roof / Dormers Waterworks Restoration Underway

Thanks to your support and <u>Ingram Construction</u>, <u>Chase's Mill</u> now has a new roof and dormers. Work was completed in May.

# **Waterworks Renovation Underway**

The planning for restoration of the penstock, turbine, and repair to the the dam has been on-going throughout last winter. In June, board member <u>Wade Smith</u> succeeded in removing the turbine and was delighted to find that while it may look rusty, it is in better shape than anticipated. Within the next few weeks, work will begin to restore the waterworks. Repairs to the dam will be phased over this summer and spring 2019.

### **Grants**

In early June, George Born of the New Hampshire Land and Community Heritage Investment Program (LCHIP) toured the Mill and deemed Phase One "complete." Phase One included leveling and shoring the building, foundation repairs, and replacing the roof and dormers. It was funded in large part by a \$100,000 grant awarded by LCHIP in December 2016. We matched these funds in spring 2017 and work began soon after.

Having completed Phase One, on June 22, board member (and historian and author) Helen Frink, our chief grant writer, submitted a new request to LCHIP for an additional \$150,000. If awarded, we will need to match these funds. These monies would be used towards completing windows, siding, electrical and other repairs necessary to open in 2020. LCHIP will announce its awards in December 2018. Stay tuned...

During the first two guarters of 2018 we received additional grants - \$6,000 from the Catalyst Fund managed by the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation, \$2,500 from the Acworth Community Charitable Trust, and \$2,000 from an Anonymous foundation. We have additional applications outstanding and continue to pursue grant opportunities. If you know of an opportunity that we should apply for, please let us know!

# **Board Changes**

After serving as Vice President for two years, **Bob Brown** recently handed over this role to Treasurer Michael Chaladoff. Bob will remain on the board and continue to oversee all aspects of construction and rehabilitation.

Margaret Chase Perry, who served on our board for six years and is a founding member, is leaving this position. One of Heman Chase's two daughters who grew up with the Mill being an important part of their lives, Margaret has brought to life its rich history and our vision for its resurrection. Her knowledge and skill as an historian and an archivist and librarian, have been invaluable. We are indebted to her for the difference she has made in shaping our work. Fortunately, she will continue cataloging items, giving tours, and generally serving as a goodwill ambassador.

New to the board is **Jim Howard** who became a year-round resident of Alstead in 2017. For the past 28 years he lived in Wenham, MA, where he served 12 of those years as chair of the Wenham Historical Commission and the Wenham Historic District. His professional experience includes developing large scale computer systems and networks. Jim's grandparents acquired a house on Homestead Road in 1920 where Jim built his current home in the 1980s.
