# Reel Opportunities in Ottawa: A Training Program for Under-represented Youth



Ottawa, ON - February 17, 2023

From February 21 - 24, 2023, REEL CANADA, in partnership with Digi60 Filmmakers' Festival, IATSE 634, hosted at the Digital Arts Resource Centre (DARC) and supported by the Ottawa Film Office, will present one in a series of "Pop-Up Film Schools" that are taking place across the country this spring as part of the **Reel Opportunities program.** 

The workshop series will consist of four days of hands-on training aimed at under-represented (i.e. people identifying as Black, Indigenous, Women, LGBTQ2S, or Persons with Disabilities) youth aged 18 - 30. The training, provided entirely by members of IATSE 634, will consist of overviews of grip, lighting, sound and special effects, as well as a general orientation and film set etiquette.

**Reel Opportunities** is a workforce development program presented by REEL CANADA aimed at creating new pathways into the Canadian film industry. For the past two years this has involved delivering remote informational workshops to high school students and community groups across the country. So far, more than 15,000 students have been reached through almost 600 such workshops. In 2023, Pop-up Film Schools will be presented in Vancouver, Calgary, Sault Ste Marie, North Bay, Ottawa and Montreal.

Funded in part by the federal government's Youth Employment Skills Strategy (YESS), the program serves youth aged 18 - 30 years.

## Digi60 Filmmakers' Festival

Digi60 is a grassroots filmmakers' festival for filmmakers, by filmmakers. Created in 2004, Digi60 facilitates opportunities for new and emerging filmmakers to screen their work in a supportive, constructive peer environment while also allowing for professional development and support for independent filmmakers in Ottawa.
