### Fall/Winter

Five Saturday training sessions, including:

- Lectures
- Workshops with artists
- Tours of outsider art collections, including Intuit's exhibitions and Henry Darger Room Collection, and the Roger Brown Study Collection
- Curricula Review

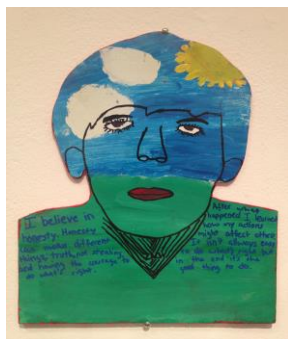
### Spring

Implementation of lesson plans inspired by self-taught and outsider art, with the support from Intuit staff and resources from Intuit's Robert A. Roth Study Center.

Participating schools' students enjoy a gallery tour at Intuit, with on-site art activities.

Site visit to classrooms and program assessments by Intuit staff.

Exhibition of students' artwork at Intuit.



## ABOUT

Intuit's Teacher Fellowship Program (TFP) is an award-winning professional development program for teachers from Chicago Public Schools. Awarded the Illinois Art Education Association's Distinguished Service in the Profession of Art Education Award in 2009 and the Illinois Association of Museums' Superior Award in 2011, TFP reaches about 600 students across Chicago annually.

Twenty teachers from ten Chicago Public Schools are selected to participate in this program. Using self-taught outsider art as a catalyst, teachers design innovative curriculum for their students.

The TFP runs throughout the academic year. Teachers participate in a series of training sessions in the fall and winter for lesson planning, followed by the implementation of their projects in classrooms. The program is completed with a public exhibition of students' work, celebrating the participants and closing of the year.
