Specializing in the assessment and treatment of Autism and other Developmental Disabilities

Nationwide Children's Hospital is recruiting psychologists in the Child Development Center (CDC). The Child Development Center is an established interdisciplinary program designed to serve the needs of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities including Autism Spectrum Disorders. The Child Development Center is part of Nationwide Children's Hospital Pediatric Behavioral Health program and is in the Division of Pediatric Psychology and Neuropsychology in the Department of Pediatrics at the Ohio State University. Our program is one of 17 sites within the Autism Speaks Autism Treatment Network and the Autism Intervention Research Network on Physical Health, and we are participants in a wide range of multi-site research projects.

We have new and expanded positions open for individuals who are interested in working in a multi-disciplinary setting focusing on the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of children referred for possible autism and other developmental delays and disabilities. Our Pediatric Neurodevelopmental Psychologists work with Developmental Behavioral Pediatricians, Neurologists, Nurse Practitioners, Speech and Language Pathologists, Psychiatrists, Social Workers, Genetic Counselors, and GI specialists in one integrated program. We have a large and diverse psychology faculty, an APPIC approved internship track, and a well-established post-doctoral clinical and research fellowship programs. Our faculty also participates in graduate student training and development as well as medical education.

We are specifically looking for psychologists interested the following areas:

- 1) Implementing short-term, targeted evidence based treatments for children with ASD/IDD.
- 2) Evidence based psychological testing for children with ASD/IDD.

Applicants who have interest and competency to specialize in identifying and treating co-occurring developmental psychopathologies in the context of autism and other developmental disabilities will be highly competitive applicants.

Applicants should have experience in working with children with developmental disabilities and/or autism spectrum disorders. Candidates must possess a doctoral degree in psychology and be license eligible in Ohio. The completion of formal post-doctoral training is highly desirable. We will consider candidates based on strengths in clinical service, clinical supervision, teaching, and also their career interests. All positions carry a faculty appointment in the Department of Pediatrics, The Ohio State University.
