

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE AJCU FACT FILES 2013-2014

This summary highlights data from Jesuit colleges and universities for the 2013-2014 academic year and includes some trends since 2003-2004. Data were gathered with the assistance of institutional researchers on each campus, using information from each institution's Common Data Set (CDS) and Fiscal Operations Report and Application to Participate (FISAP), as well as an additional survey from the AJCU office.

The summary is in two parts: **(1) Capsule Statements** and **(2) Supporting Data**

(1) Capsule Statements

Enrollment and Retention

- The grand total headcount of all students at AJCU schools decreased slightly from 216,028 in 2012-13 to 215,121 in 2013-14. The total undergraduate enrollment increased slightly from 135,817 in 2012-13 to 136,375 in 2013-14. (See I.a below)
- The female / male ratio for enrolled undergraduate students was 57 / 43 in 2013-14, remaining roughly the same since 2003-04. (See I.b below)
- In 2012-13, the average freshman admission rate was 62.7%, while in 2013-14, the average acceptance rate was 63.2%. The acceptance rates in 2013-14 ranged from 17.1% to 92.3%. The average percentage of freshmen entering with a GPA of 3.0 or higher decreased slightly from 88.1% in 2012-13 to 87.8% in 2013-14. (See II.a & II.b below)
- The percentage of freshman students coming from Jesuit high schools in 2013-14 was 7.2%, the same as it was in 2012-13. (See II.c below)
- Schools were less selective in their acceptance of transfer applicants, accepting an average 46% in 2013-14; in 2012-13, 40.3% of transfer applicants were accepted. In 2013-14, an average 46.1% of admitted students enrolled. (See III below)
- For the Fall 2007 cohort, the average 6-year graduation rate in 2013-14 was 73.5%, with a range from 53.0% to 92.0%; the average was slightly below the average of 73.9% in 2012-13. In 2013-14, the average 4-year graduation rate was 63.6%, ranging from 33.6% to 89.0%; the average was 64% in 2012-13. (See page 3 in Fact Files)
- The average retention rate for freshmen has stayed at or above 85% since 2001-02. It was 86.6% in 2013-14, slightly higher than 86.4% in 2012-13. (See IV below)
- The average percentage of minority undergraduates was 29.3% in 2013-14. In 2013-14, the percentages ranged from 10.3% to 74.0%. This information is the result of changes to the formula used in prior years to more accurately calculate the percentage of minority students on each campus. (See V below)

Student Life

- In 2013-14, an average 51.0% of freshmen and an average 47.1% of undergraduate students were from out of state. An average 85.2% of freshmen and 56.1% of undergraduate students lived in college-run housing. (See VI.a and VI.b below)
- Of those students declaring a religion in 2013-14, an average 58.3% of undergraduate students identified themselves as "Catholic," 17.7% as "other Christian," 1.1% marked "Jewish," 1.5% marked "Muslim," and 13.1% marked "Other." (See VI.c below)

- In 2013-14, undergraduate students completed an estimated 2.2 million hours* of community service. On average, an estimated 63.5%* of undergraduate students participated in community service. (See VI.d below)

Faculty, Alumni, Trustees

- The total number of instructional faculty at AJCU schools for 2013-14 was 21,733; the percentage of minority faculty was 13.8%, an increase from 12.7% in 2012-13. In 2013-14, 47.5% of faculty were women, an increase from 46.1% in 2012-13. The average student/teacher ratio remained 12x1 in 2013-14. (See VII below)
- The percentage of Jesuits on faculty increased from 1.4% in 2012-13 to 1.5% in 2013-14. (See VII below)
- In 2013-14, AJCU schools reported 2,059,811 living alumni; the total number of living alumni at AJCU institutions has increased annually from 1,493,528 since 2001-02. (See VIII below)
- The average number of trustees for AJCU institutions in 2013-14 was 36, a slight decrease from 37 in 2012-13. Each board has, on average, 7 Jesuits and 8 women. These last two averages are exactly the same as in 2012-13. (See IX below)

Finances and Financial Aid

- In 2013-14, the average operational expenses for all institutions were \$268,449,808, while the average operational revenues were \$287,243,433. (See X below)
- In 2013-14, the total endowments added up to \$11.5 billion, an increase from \$10.3 billion in 2012-13. The average endowment in 2013-14 was \$424 million, an increase from the \$369 million average in 2012-13. (See X below)
- The average percentage of alumni contributing decreased, from 15.2% in 2012-13 to 14.2% in 2013-14. (See XI below)
- On average, tuition and fees rose 2.8% from 2013-14 to 2014-15, less than the average increase of 3.8% from 2012-13 to 2013-14. The average tuition and fees for 2014-15 was \$38,187, ranging from \$29,240 to \$47,436. (See XII below) The average tuition discount rate for freshman students increased from 46.7% in 2012-13 to 47.7% in 2013-14. (See page 20 in Fact Files)
- The total amount of federal grants (combined Pell and SEOG) for all AJCU schools in 2013-14 was \$138,738,823, an increase from \$134,298,006 in 2012-13 (See XIII.a below). The total amount of institutional grants distributed to full-time undergraduate students in 2013-14 was \$1.6 billion, an increase from \$1.5 billion in 2012-13. (See page 21 in Fact Files)
