Police update July 2017

There have been four reports of theft from vehicles in the Thurcaston area this month. These offences have taken place on a number of different dates in the areas of All Saints Road, Leicester Road and Anstey Lane.

Crime prevention advice

Distraction thefts and burglaries have been reported in Leicestershire during the last few months so please be aware of persons who may be asking for help or directions. Also be careful of where you leave your property - if you can see it then so can a potential thief. Incidents have been reported of criminals approaching people at locations such as cafes, placing maps over property such as mobile phones and then asking for directions. When the offender removes the map they also pick up the property before the victim realises that it has gone.

Please also remember to check identification of all callers visiting your property. Verify who the callers says they are by ringing the company (making sure you get the contact number from a trusted source, such as yellow pages or a utility bill and not the person).
