FOR THE GROUP: Working it out together

1. The book of Psalms is more commonly known to praise and give thanks, have you ever used or searched the Psalms to express your sorrows? Explain.
2. Read Psalm 91:1-4. Does this scripture give you comfort and encouragement? Explain.
3. Pastor Steve said, “Biblically, to shelter in the promises of the Lord is a choice...God makes His protective promises available, you must choose to shelter yourself in the promises of God.” What is your understanding of “shelter in the promises of God”?
4. In the video shared, when the rain started the baby chicks ran to shelter under their mother’s wings. When the storms of life cloud your day, where do you run for shelter?
5. Pastor Steve said, “Although most people who choose to make God their shelter, do so in a time of crisis, you don’t need a crisis to take shelter under God’s wings.” How can you stay in the shelter of God?
6. Does shelter in God mean we will have life without trouble? Read John 16:33 and Romans 8:35. Explain
7. If life has trouble, even in the shelter of God, how can one have peace and joy? Read Romans 14:17 and John 14:1, 16-27.
8. Pastor Steve said, “God is inviting you into the shelter of a relationship with Him...but you have to come to Him.” (Mat. 11:28) How can recognizing your transformation into a new creation (Gal. 6:14) help you to take shelter in God?
