### BEASLEY REPORTS \$7.5 MILLION Q1 PROFIT

[Beasley Broadcast Group Inc.](#) posted a first-quarter profit of \$7.5 million, up from \$1.8 million in the same period a year ago. The Naples-based company reported revenue of \$53.7 for the quarter compared with \$27.5 million in Q1 2016. The results reflect the company's legacy Beasley Broadcast Group broadcasting and digital operations and the results from the acquired Greater Media's 18 stations.
