Also included is information about two (2) books... Journey of Hope, a 302 page book of articles, poems, short stories and humor that takes the reader into death row and allows them to feel the full scale of loss and emotions those on death row experience. The second book... Common Sense Thoughts on the Christian Lifestyle, a 160 page book which contains 24 lessons written specifically for prisoners at the request of a prison ministry.

The importance of getting the word out about this material is twofold. First, because these books contain material that demonstrates those on America's death rows can, and do, contribute to both

society and what should be a meaningful dialogue about capital punishment.


