Examples of Learning Experiences

100 Blessings

Created for Beth Sholom of Anchorage, Alaska

What is a blessing and why do we say it? Students and their parents were guided through a multi-modality program to find out. Beginning with song, and moving through text study, theater games, and art, participants came to the conclusion that blessings are tools to foster gratitude. They were then empowered to write, illustrate, and share their own blessings to use every day.

As if YOU left Egypt: An Interactive Exodus

Created for Plainview Jewish Center of Long Island, New York

This program for K-3 students and their families wove songs and stories to immerse participants in the story of the Exodus. We began with the idea that each person is meant to see themselves as if they left Egypt. After transforming into Miriam, I guided the group through the story, including moments of questions, discussion, and play.

Shir Chadash: How do we learn a new song?

Created for Merrick Jewish Center of Long Island, New York

In a synagogue without a singing culture, how do we inspire students to sing? In this first of a series of four visits, students were lead in a song-session that explored the meta-question of how we learn songs. Beginning with popular songs, and moving to call and response, simple melodies, and songs with movement, students discovered for themselves how to learn new songs, and the value of group singing.
