

A NOTE ABOUT THE OPERA

"Everyone knows Amahl..."

Well, in the opera world at least, it certainly feels that way. Given how often Amahl and the Night Visitors is presented across the country, it just seemed to make sense to create a work that would seamlessly pair and flow into Menotti's beloved holiday opera. Opera Orlando has already produced Amahl three times in its brief history and it was always well received, with patrons clamoring for us to do it every year to make it a holiday tradition, much like The Nutcracker or A Christmas Carol are for our ballet and theater friends. The only challenge is that Amahl is a rather short opera—about 60 minutes long to be exact which definitely leaves some folks wanting more. So, what to pair with Amahl? THAT was the question.

The concept of a story within a story, or a play within a play, is always a fun one and very effective, as seen in Pagliacci or Ariadne auf Naxos. That idea became the foundation of our brainstorming for a double bill. We started by considering the cast members and voice types already present in Amahl and where those might lead us. Well, with Three Kings and a Page, you have four male voices that just happen to be in the right ranges for a barbershop quartet, an obvious conclusion there. And with Amahl and the Mother you know you will have a boy soprano and need some storyline involving a child and his mother. Hmmm... what do children love most during the holidays... well that part was easy... Santa!! And instead of just one, why not four of them, a whole barbershop guartet of Kris Kingles, in fact. It all just made sense and instantly conjured up an evocative image of four barbershop-singing Santa Clauses on the side of the highway with some car trouble, still keeping spirits bright by singing well-loved Christmas tunes in tight four-part harmonies.

Now, how do we connect our four Santas with the mother and son. and eventually to a performance of Amahl and the Night Visitors? This is where Christopher Guest and Eugene Levy's niche film—but required viewing for any theater student, really—Waiting for Guffman served as inspiration. There is inherent drama and comedy behind the scenes of any theatrical production at any level, that is just a fact, but perhaps even more so for those thrown together last-minute community productions that we have all been involved with at our churches, schools, or community theaters. That is where the real magic and comedy happen. Hence, Amahl and the Mother become Rudy and Judy on their way to their local community group's production of Amahl and the Night Visitors where they will be, of course, featured in the main roles. BUT they just so happen to come across four lost Santas stranded on the highway doing their best to stay merry and hoping for a Christmas miracle. What ensues next, well, no spoiler alerts here...

AMAHL AND THE NIGHT VISITORS

composer + librettist

Gian Carlo Menotti was born in Cadegliano, Italy. His father was a businessman and his mother was a talented musician. She taught her young son the rudiments of music, and Menotti used this education to gain admittance to the Milan Conservatory at age 13. He then moved to the United States and studied at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia

It was with The Medium that established Menotti as one of the foremost composer-librettists of modern opera. It ran for 211 performances at the Ethel Barrymore Theater on Broadway from 1947-48 and was accompanied by a "curtain-raiser" one-act, The Telephone. Menotti's first full-length opera, The Consul, considered by many to be his greatest work, opened at the Ethel Barrymore Theater on March 15, 1950. This searing contemporary work describing the plight of political fugitives trying to escape an unnamed police state but failing to obtain the necessary visa had an eight-month run and received the Pulitzer Prize and the Drama Critics Award. Just a few months later on Christmas Eve of 1951, the first opera written expressly for television, Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors, was broadcast on NBC.

In addition to being awarded the Kennedy Center Honors for lifetime achievement in the arts and being named "Musician of the Year" by Musical America in 1991, Menotti also organized the Festival of Two Worlds in Spoleto, Italy. In 1977, he inaugurated the American counterpart of the festival in Charleston, South Carolina.

4 LOST SANTAS composer + librettists



Spicer Carr composer + co-librettist + co-orchestrator

Spicer Carr is a New York based composer-lyricist. As a queer, autistic writer, Carr seeks out similarly underrepresented voices, and uses his unique perspective to help explore their stories. Current projects include Fluffernutter, a mono-opera on memory and fluff, commissioned by Opera Praktikos and Too Bright to See, a new musical based on the award winning book by Kyle Lukoff. Other additions in Carr's vocal catalogue include the song cycle

U Up?, musicals Chance the Snapper and The Rocking Boy, and the opera Sabbath. Carr has also written several children's plays, and his work has been developed, supported, and performed by Cincinnati Song Initiative, The National Association of Teachers of Singing, Quintessence Theatre Group, Opera America, The TYE Center, MusiCoLab, Temple University Theater, The Purple Crayon Players, and Really Spicy Opera. Spicer is a graduate of Temple University.



Rose Freeman | librettist

Rose Freeman is an award winning stage director, teacher, writer, and producer of theatre and opera. They have directed a wide array of plays, environmental events, burlesque acts, nationally touring hiphop concerts, and new musicals and operas. Freeman is a founding ensemble member of Third Eye Theatre Ensemble, and member emeritus for the DirectorsLabChicago steering committee and NwAC. They have

served on panels for National Opera Association, Chicago Theatre Symposium, and Opera America, and they are a recipient of the National Opera Association's 2020 JoElyn Wakefield-Wright Stage Director Fellowship and Philadelphia's 2022 Illuminate the Arts grant.

SYNOPSIS

SETTING: the present

PLACE: the side of the road and a community theater

4 LOST SANTAS

A barbershop quartet of Santas (Barry, Gary, Larry, and Terry) are lost and stranded on the side of the road with a broken-down car, missing their big break at SantaCon. A mother and son (Judy and Rudy), who are running late to perform in a production of *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, see them, and Rudy is amazed at the sight. He insists that he and his mother should help them, but Judy is reluctant to assist as she is anxious to get to the show. Rudy, however, reminds her that, "The most important rule or creed is to help those in need!"

After a lot of Christmas carols, friendship, and maybe even a little love at first sight, Judy yields. Not able to fix the car, everyone piles into Judy's car and they head to the theater. They arrive to a stage manager in full panic. All three kings and the page have bailed on the *Amahl* production to go sing in a quartet at SantaCon. Talk about weird coincidences?! The production is about to be canceled until the Santas realize they can save the day and play the parts, because, "everyone's done *Amahl* before!"

The show is saved, and everyone gets their Christmas wish.

AMAHL AND THE NIGHT VISITORS

The lights dim and the community theater production of *Amahl* and the *Night Visitors* begins with Amahl playing his shepherd's pipe outside. His mother calls him inside and tries to get him to sleep, but Amahl is full of stories and tall tales. Half listening, Amahl's mother readies the house for the night. As they finally drift off to sleep, there is a knock at the door. The Three Kings, on their way to deliver gifts to a newborn baby, ask to stay the night. Amahl is excited by the Kings' visit, and what starts as any other night becomes a night of wonder and miracles reaffirming the importance of unconditional love, faith, and charity.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

When I was Amahl's age and in Catholic School, I remember my teachers carefully explaining that the reason there were multiple nativity stories was because there were many reasons for Christmas: Christ came not just for the kings (the rich) and not just the shepherds (the poor), but both. Christmas is for everybody. My favorite part of Menotti's *Amahl and the Night Visitors* is the imagining of how both groups could have found each other on a cold winter's night on their way to the newborn king — and the inevitable miracles born from that encounter.

Gabriel Preisser's concept is a cheekily brilliant addition to Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors. 4 Lost Santas is meant to echo the tale of Amahl, highlighting how the stories we tell are often mirrored in our daily lives. Menotti is quoted on his inspiration for Amahl by comparing the kings to Santa Claus: "You see, when I was a child I lived in Italy, and in Italy, we have no Santa Claus. I suppose that Santa Claus is much too busy with American children to be able to handle Italian children as well! Our gifts were brought to us by the Three Kings, instead."

Of course, the reason for Amahl and the Night Visitors now being a Christmas tradition among many operagoers is in its powerful message of sacrifice. The mother has nothing to give the Christ child and ends up sending what matters most to her in the world: her child. When Amahl sings, "But Mother, let me send him my crutch. Who knows, he may need one, and this I made myself," he doesn't know he won't need the crutch himself. He has nothing to give and still does - which is worth more than all the rubies and gold the kings are carrying. The tradition of gift-giving brings up many concerns of what we are able to give the world when we feel that what we have is insufficient, whether we find ourselves materially wealthy or poor. We look around at need and think, what can we give? Yes, material support is helpful and necessary, but often the greatest gift is something simpler: ourselves. It's tempting to think of miracles as something that happens to us instead of what we do - but that's almost never the case. We are the miracle. Sometimes, we're the knock at the door, the gathering of community to feed weary travelers or the sacrifice of the crutch. Sometimes, we're the broken-down car, and sometimes we're the one pulling over even though we're late to our show. The
