

CALVARY REACHING WITHIN

ACOLYTES: Enhance the congregation's experience of the service by carrying crosses, torches, flags, and banners in the procession, as well as assisting in the preparation of the Eucharist at the altar.

ALTAR GUILD: Prepare the altar and sanctuary for all Sunday, weekday, and special services, including weddings and funerals.

BREAKFAST HOSTS: Greet parishioners and serve as cashier for those who attend our parish breakfast from 8:30-9:30 a.m. each Sunday.

CALVARY CHOIR: Sing to enrich worship with a semi-professional group of singers; professional musicians provide a strong foundation for the many volunteers who participate.

CALVARY RINGERS: Ring bells once a month to enrich worship. The ability to read music is not required.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS: Administer the bread and wine during Holy Eucharist.

EUCCHARISTIC VISITORS: Bring the bread and wine of the Eucharist to those who cannot leave their homes or hospital rooms.

FLOWER GUILD: Arrange flowers on the altar each week and adorn the church for major feast days such as Christmas Eve and Easter Day.

GREETERS: Greet visitors every Sunday morning, welcoming people into Calvary's buildings and providing directions and information for newcomers.


LECTORS: Read the appointed lessons for the day or lead the congregation in the prayers of the people, (Intercessor).

SMALL GROUPS: Connect with others in a more personal setting than only on Sunday mornings. Current groups include Foyers, Bible Study, Book Study, ROMEOs, and JULIETs. Join one or start a new one.

TRANSPORTATION: Provide transportation to those who do not have it, on Sundays and throughout the week.

USHERS: Make people feel welcome when they arrive, distribute worship bulletins, offer assistance in seating, and collect the offering.

WEDDING GUILD: Assist couples who are planning to be married, act as the church's representative at rehearsals and weddings, and assist the clergy at these functions.





CALVARY REACHING OUT

COMMUNITY BREAKFAST: serving 150 homeless and poor neighbors who eat and pray with us here at Calvary each Sunday morning. *Scramble eggs, serve, wash dishes, make coffee, etc.*

COMMUNITY BREAKFAST PREP: preparing for Sunday breakfast by *cracking eggs, placing bacon in pans, etc.* on Saturdays.

CALVARY CLOTHES CLOSET: providing individuals here at Calvary an opportunity to select much needed clothes, blankets, and toiletries. *Collect clothes from friends and neighbors, publicize the need for clothes, and help guests with their selections monthly from 7-8 a.m.*

EMMANUEL CENTER: striving to break the cycle of poverty through education and strengthening young minds, bodies and spirits within a context of Christian witness. *Tutor, collect school supplies, or mentor.*

EMMANUEL MEAL: serving a Christmas luncheon at Calvary to our homeless and poor neighbors on Monday, December 21. *Serve, host, purchase turkeys.*

FRIENDS OF THISTLE FARMS: providing opportunities for women who have been victims of trafficking with a social enterprise of bees and herbs for teas. *Garden, fund raise, and assist with marketing.*

GRIZZLIES PREP: educating young men in grades six to eight, prepar-

ing all students to excel academically, and demonstrating integrity. *Eat a 30-minute lunch with a student weekly.*

THE HOSPITALITY HUB: connecting individuals with the resources they need to begin their journey out of homelessness. *Serve as a counselor, organize toiletries, update database, and write grants.*

JAIL MINISTRY: providing ministry for inmates in the Criminal Justice Center. *Help lead ministry monthly.*

LIVES WORTH SAVING: meeting needs of our police department and our District Attorney to respond to trafficking and prostitution in our city by offering women a safe path to a new life. *Serve and eat lunch with attendees.*

MEMPHIS TEACHER RESIDENCY: providing students in partner low-income Memphis neighborhoods with the same, or better, quality of education as is available to any student in Memphis by recruiting, training, and supporting effective teachers within a Christian context. *Adopt-a-Teacher by inviting them to lunch and providing them with moral support during their work on a Master's degree in Urban Education.*

MIFA (MEMPHIS INTERFAITH ASSOCIATION): supporting the independence of vulnerable seniors and families in crisis. *Deliver a delicious meal through Meals on Wheels.*

RED KETTLE BELL RINGING: enabling the Christmas campaign of The Salvation Army to provide food, toys and clothing to 6 million people during the Christmas season and helping more than 34 million Americans recovering from personal disasters nationwide. *Ring a bell at a local grocery store.*

ROOM IN THE INN; serving people experiencing homelessness by providing emergency shelter and meals during the coldest months of the year—November through March—sharing the love of God through hospitality. *Prepare meals, host neighbors, and assist with logistics.*

SOUP SUNDAY: providing nutritious soup from scratch once a month to parishioners to help fund Calvary's hunger ministries. *Chop vegetables, fill containers, and sell delicious soup monthly.*
