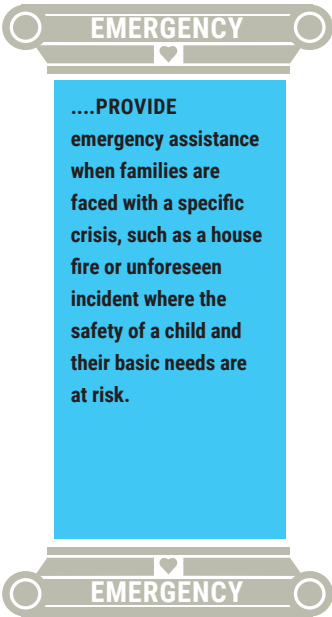
Of course, we could not do any of this without the support of you, our donors. During our last fiscal year, you once again helped us to set records in terms of our support to the community. For example, our signature **Head-to-Toe** program served more than 600 area children and we were able to award 23 new college scholarships. When the second “once in a century” storm in the past twelve years hit our community in July 2023, your generosity enabled us to respond quickly, providing well over a half-million dollars of relief within the first seven weeks. Perhaps, just as importantly, we were able to assist those in need with FEMA applications, insurance claim filings and other daunting tasks when they needed it most, during an amazingly stressful time. Another example of helping to provide hope when it is difficult to see beyond the problems of today.

In the pages that follow, we invite you to read about how we are putting your donations to work in our community. Thank you for your continued support and trust in us to be good stewards of your charitable giving. 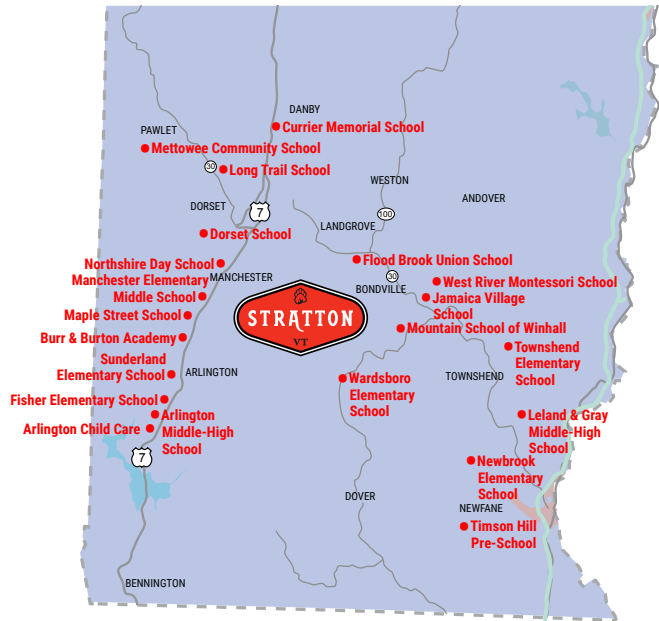


COMMUNITY FACTS:

- Our region has a great deal of economic diversity where up to 80% of children qualify for free-reduced meals at school. A family of 4 earning \$51,388 qualifies their children who depend on school meals as their primary source of food.
- Windham County shows the highest rate of mental health crisis compared to the rest of the state, with a particularly high rate of depression. Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among those age 10-24 years old. In Vermont, there are 2-3 deaths per week, affecting children, families, schools and entire communities.
- Vermont has the 2nd highest state rate of homelessness in the country (2023), second to New York. Families without homes have tripled since 2020. There are approximately 104 school-aged children and youth experiencing homelessness or are "unaccompanied youth" within the foundation's footprint.
- Up to 50% of household adults have a high school diploma or less education, and many children are the first in their families to graduate high school.

Our rural and remote footprint spans 20 towns and touches three counties, made up of approximately 20,000 individuals and 3,500 children.



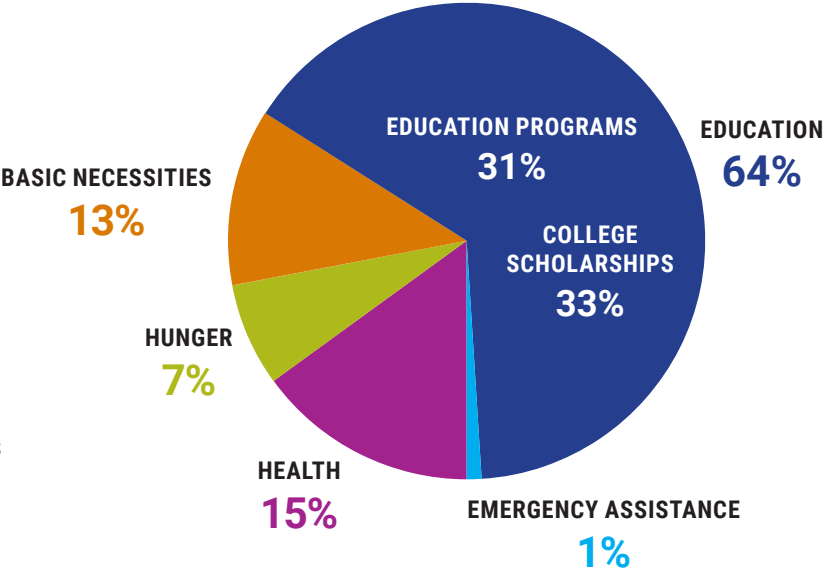

HOPE-FILLED HORIZONS

From Basics to Beyond

The Stratton Community Foundation endeavors to overcome life's storms, especially for the innocent.

Every day, you empower children of all ages to thrive and flourish to reach a new potential.

Often found seeking advice from her guidance counselor, the teen explored her options with a mix of uncertainty and overwhelming possibilities that she had never had before about going to college or starting a career. Finally exasperated, she cried, *"How can I prepare for a life I never thought I'd be alive to see?"*

When fundamental, critical needs cannot be met, envisioning a better future can be clouded, if not made impossible by the challenges of poverty, including hunger, poor health, lack of confidence and limited resources. Such hopelessness might also be compounded by rural-mountain isolation, trauma, and dysfunction.

For the young teen mentioned above, living on her own at a very young age, survival was her priority and her 'today' was all that mattered, until she embarked on an experiential learning trip her senior year of high school, funded by the Stratton Community Foundation. The trip opened her eyes, filled her mind with hope,

and allowed her to dream about a different life for herself outside of the difficult world she grew up in. A journey to NYC and beyond transformed this child into someone who had the ability to pursue her future. Fast forward, she is the first in her family to even apply to college and was awarded a family-pledged college scholarship through the foundation. She told her scholarship family during her senior year, *"You didn't know me then, but you've been supporting me my whole life. As a donor to the foundation, you fed me, clothed me, gave me opportunities – supported me like I was your own child."*

Through this child's true story, we see a reflection of so many children who stand under the umbrella of the Stratton Community Foundation. From early literacy to basic needs to college and career choices, we stay with our children as they grow, never breaking stride. Our work is more than just a mission to us; it is a lifeline to them.

We share in the marvel of watching these children transform, their journeys are illuminated by your invaluable support.

Through collaborative and innovative community programs, we instill hope, foster resilience through adversity, and equip children with the tools they need to shape their own futures.

Basic Necessities

665 children served

Our **Signature Head-to-Toe Program** gifted more than 600 children with winter coats and pants, warm socks and boots, and winter accessories, school backpacks and supplies, dental kits, and new sneakers in the spring. **Head-to-Toe** relieves the cruelty of bullying, improves school attendance, impacts mental health, and frees children to embrace the joys of childhood. For children, it fosters a sense of belonging, pride, and confidence. For families, it extends precious income to pay for essentials, housing, and transportation. For schools, **Head-to-Toe** empowers those with feet on the ground to provide unparalleled care for their students, fostering a more positive and inclusive learning environment. Within **Head-to-Toe** is our signature Moving Mountains Fund that helps our schools to handle daily, time sensitive and sometimes life-saving situations.

How basic is basic?

This year we also supported an elementary school in Danby to install a shower for children who do not have the luxury of consistent access to clean water, who are living in campers, or who have parents unable to pay utilities.

"Not having what they need to be clean impacts a child's relationships with peers, their overall health, and their own self-esteem. One little boy shouts with each shower, 'I feel so clean!' This, and the washer and dryer at school [granted last year] to clean soiled clothing empowers teachers and staff to care for those in dire need and empowers the child to feel worthy of a future that is better."

The rising cost of living, including food prices, results in food insecurity for many hardworking families who simply do not know where the next meal is coming from. The foundation’s philosophy is that by helping the parents to provide, the children are the real beneficiaries. Through our grants, we helped support multiple community food shelves and school snack programs to mitigate unwanted attention for impoverished students. Our schools host an economically diverse student population, striving to ensure equitable access to all programs, including hot meals.

The most vulnerable students who rely on school meals are remembered through the eight weeks of summer, and in addition to funding support, the SCF served as a major resource to share open-food sites across the state for children of all ages to visit schools and receive 7 days worth of breakfast, lunch and dinner or to eat meals on-site, funded by a federal grant through the Vermont Agency of Education.

Among our biggest hunger efforts is the foundation’s **Signature Feed the Community Grocery Cards** that meet families where they are today, providing a hand-up to those facing financial

hardship. Cards are distributed through a legion of partner organizations that know those who are struggling.

A single mother, trying to make ends meet, received grocery cards and **Head-to-Toe** items for her and her daughter. This assistance provided a sense of hope that empowered mom to extend what she was earning, find a better job and secure her own home. This program is crucial for many families like this one, where with a little help, they can thrive and uplift the community.

These moments to intervene and to alleviate suffering play a compelling role in a child’s mental health. The Nathan M. Carreira Endowment Fund is dedicated to supporting various mental health initiatives within the community, including individual counseling for children, major events, and Mental Health First Aid training. Additionally, the #Shred4Nate candygram distribution across our schools aims to spread kindness and positivity.



Mentorship — Mya and Isabella

Trauma and chronic stress often lead to intense emotions and high energy levels. The Bennington-Rutland Supervisory Union has created a sensitive support Anchor Program where children can enter a safe space when in emotional crisis to learn coping strategies and to release pent-up anger and energy so they can return to the classroom unencumbered.

Two strong peer mentorship programs are proving to be fundamental to the lives of 158 area teens and their younger mentees.



Mentorship — Charlie and Elijah

Mentorships aim to create lasting relationships, providing a supportive environment for youth in the community. Through our signature **Mentorship at Burr & Burton Academy** and a strong partnership with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Vermont, these initiatives offer comprehensive training, regular check-ins, and engagement. Mentors gain leadership experience, while mentees benefit from increased confidence, academic performance, and social skills. “Littles,” are selectively matched with high school mentors, “Bigs,” through relatable experiences, such as difficult home-lives, poverty, or bullying. As role models, Bigs guide their Littles through problems and “show up,” steering them toward positive life choices. Littles gain meaningful relationships and a firm sense of community that helps them navigate difficult emotional-behavioral connections in preparation for the big transition into high school.

The Stratton Community Foundation dedicates significant funds to support various health programs, including those that promote mental well-being, physical health, and youth development. Direct Service to Youth and Resilience through Understanding programs through the Collaborative reach hundreds of students and their families with trauma informed care. Through healthy activities youth develop essential social and interpersonal skills and learn to avoid negative behaviors.

We continue to be a leader in promoting in-school dental hygiene and influencing schools in our region to take on the effort. As a partner of the Vermont State 802 Network and Southern Vermont Oral Health Coalition, we coordinate hygienists, consent forms, training, and supplies. The program has benefited over 230 children in Mettawee and Currier Memorial Schools, where poverty rates are 50%-75%. In addition, 2,400 complete dental kits were distributed to all of our schools in February for Children’s Oral Health Month.

Low-literacy rates in low-income rural communities present significant challenges for children’s development. Research-based library programs address this issue by empowering parents to become effective readers and engage their children in interactive storytelling. Through these programs, children develop vital vocabulary, imagination, and foundational skills that are essential for brain development.

Experiential Learning & Education

Experiential learning, particularly in the outdoors, can significantly impact rural poverty by providing children with opportunities to broaden their horizons and develop essential skills. Despite living near multiple lakes, mountain trails and ski resorts, the cost of equipment, registration fees, and travel expenses can be prohibitive for families living on limited incomes. As a result, many children miss out on the opportunities that recreation and sports can provide, such as physical

activity, skill development, and social connections. By offering field trips, after-school activities, digital literacy training, wilderness survival skills, and winter sports programs, children build confidence, develop essential skills for personal and professional growth, including potential employment opportunities in their own backyard.

Student Success and Academic Intervention

As a primary funder of “Success Programs” at Burr & Burton Academy and the Taconic and Green Union schools across our footprint, students are enveloped into a community of support, direction, mentorship, and accountability, resulting in lower truancy, higher graduation rates and concrete career plans. Following the motto “goals, habit, growth,” students from low-income households or in at-risk circumstances receive encouragement and connect with academic resources. The Academic Interventionist at Burr & Burton Academy targets support for skill deficits, executive function issues, and mental health concerns. The program has helped hundreds of students, especially those from economically insecure backgrounds, improve their academic performance and develop essential skills for success.

Opportunity Scholarships*

In partnership with the Zion Episcopal Church of Manchester, our signature Summer Opportunity Scholarships provide funding for students to pursue meaningful experiences, such as internships and college courses, that contribute to their personal and professional development. These scholarships empower students to envision and work towards successful futures, preventing them from feeling trapped in stagnant situations. Students realize their dreams and confirm their goals in a variety of industries – education, art, flight, musical theater, film, foreign service, entrepreneurship, engineering, automotive, and health care. **Since the program’s inception in 2017, over \$200,000 in scholarships have transformed the lives of**

Career and Trade Scholarships*

Up to 36%-40% of graduating seniors enter the workforce directly after high school without the necessary resources for education, training, or out-of-pocket expenses. The Charles S. & Millicent P. Brown Family Foundation Trade Career Scholarship, established in 2023, seeks to address this gap and empower students to achieve their career goals. Graduating seniors who have demonstrated a commitment to their chosen field, such as lineman, culinary, cosmetology, automotive, or medical practices, receive a one-time scholarship, providing a valuable avenue for financial stability and community investment.

College Scholarships*

The Stratton Community Foundation is committed to supporting deserving local graduating seniors who demonstrate financial need and exceptional promise in their pursuit of higher education. By partnering with generous donor families, the Foundation offers four-year

scholarships to help these students achieve their goals of success and economic independence. Research indicates that financial resources play a crucial role in a student’s decision to enroll in college, especially for those from low-income backgrounds. A four-year college scholarship can be a transformative investment in a child’s future, opening doors to opportunities, increasing earning potential, enhancing critical thinking skills, building confidence, and creating a ripple effect of positive change.

One “unaccompanied minor,” who does not live with parents nor receives any support from them, went from feeling “hopeless” to realizing her parents’ failures were not her failures. On a scholarship, she is headed to college to major in nursing. “Everything worth pursuing comes with a little pain,” she concluded.

The foundation is dedicated to fostering a culture of long-term giving, encouraging donor families to make a pledge that will significantly benefit future generations.

In 2024, scholarships valued at \$279,000 were awarded, bringing the total number of scholarships granted since 2022 to 55, with a combined value of \$669,000.

All grown up and here we are today....

Eventually the clouds cleared for the despondent teen in the guidance counselor’s office. Growing up in abject poverty and being told that college is a waste of money, this “complicated miracle” began to dream. With the help of her counselor, friends, and community, she sees a brighter future for herself, earning a 4-year college scholarship. The counselor shared that hers is “not just a story of transformation but rather a journey of discovery and acceptance...she has always been ‘this’ person; she just didn’t know how to love the version of herself that dared to dream.”

Our success is paramount to the vitality of southern Vermont’s rural communities. Thanks to your generosity, we not only enhance the lives of countless individuals but also strengthen the fabric of our region.

A COMMUNITY RISES: Our Flood Relief Efforts

When the torrential rains of July 2023 swept through our region, they left a trail of destruction that would test our community's resilience. In just 48 hours, the tranquil landscape was transformed into a chaotic scene of flooded roads, damaged homes, and displaced families. As the waters receded, the full extent of the devastation became apparent.

Our organization, committed to serving the needs of our community, immediately pivoted to address the urgent crisis. What began as a planned fiscal year was quickly overshadowed by the overwhelming demands of flood relief. Donations poured in from both longtime supporters and new benefactors, demonstrating the community's unwavering spirit of generosity.



The Stratton Community Foundation presented an award to **Flood Relief Project Manager, Patti Komline** for her tireless leadership in coordinating resources and extending exceptional care during flood relief efforts.

In the weeks that followed, we distributed well over \$500,000 to those impacted by the flooding, providing much-needed assistance as they navigated the complex insurance and FEMA processes. Our experienced team, led by our reinstated Project Relief Manager, Patti Komline, worked tirelessly to assess individual needs and provide tailored support.

Through our on-the-ground efforts, we reached out to 83 individuals and businesses, offering compassionate guidance and advocacy. We established a presence at the local fire station, creating a space where affected families could share their experiences and receive support. We provided essential supplies, such as fans, dehumidifiers, and cleaning supplies, and helped families begin the recovery process.

Through it all, we managed the unexpected and furthered our mission.

Beyond immediate needs, we worked to ensure long-term stability for those displaced by the flooding. We assisted families in finding temporary housing and reunited family members who had been separated by the disaster. Our network of partners expanded significantly, allowing us to connect individuals with social services and other resources.

One year later, our flood relief efforts continue. We remain a point of contact for the state's long-term recovery efforts, providing guidance and support to those still affected by the disaster. Additionally, we are leading a flood mitigation initiative in collaboration with local

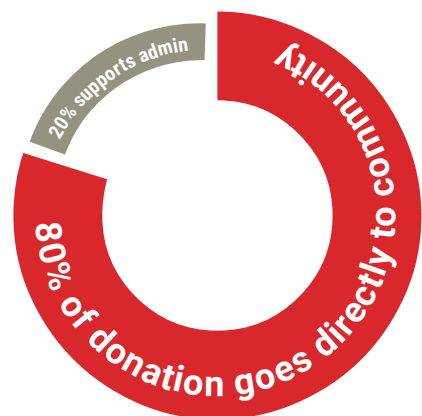

and state officials. Through a comprehensive assessment process, we are helping homeowners understand potential flood risks and develop strategies to protect their properties.

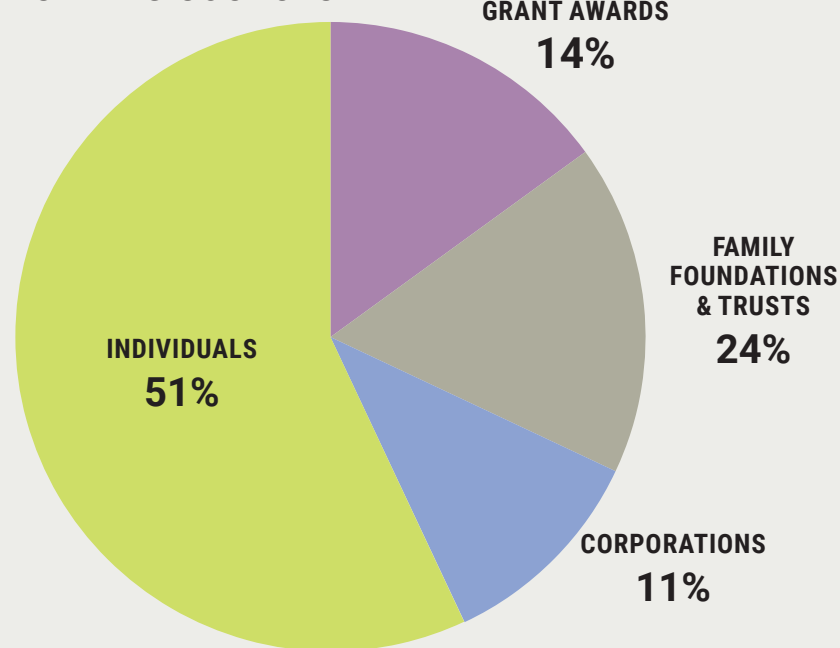
