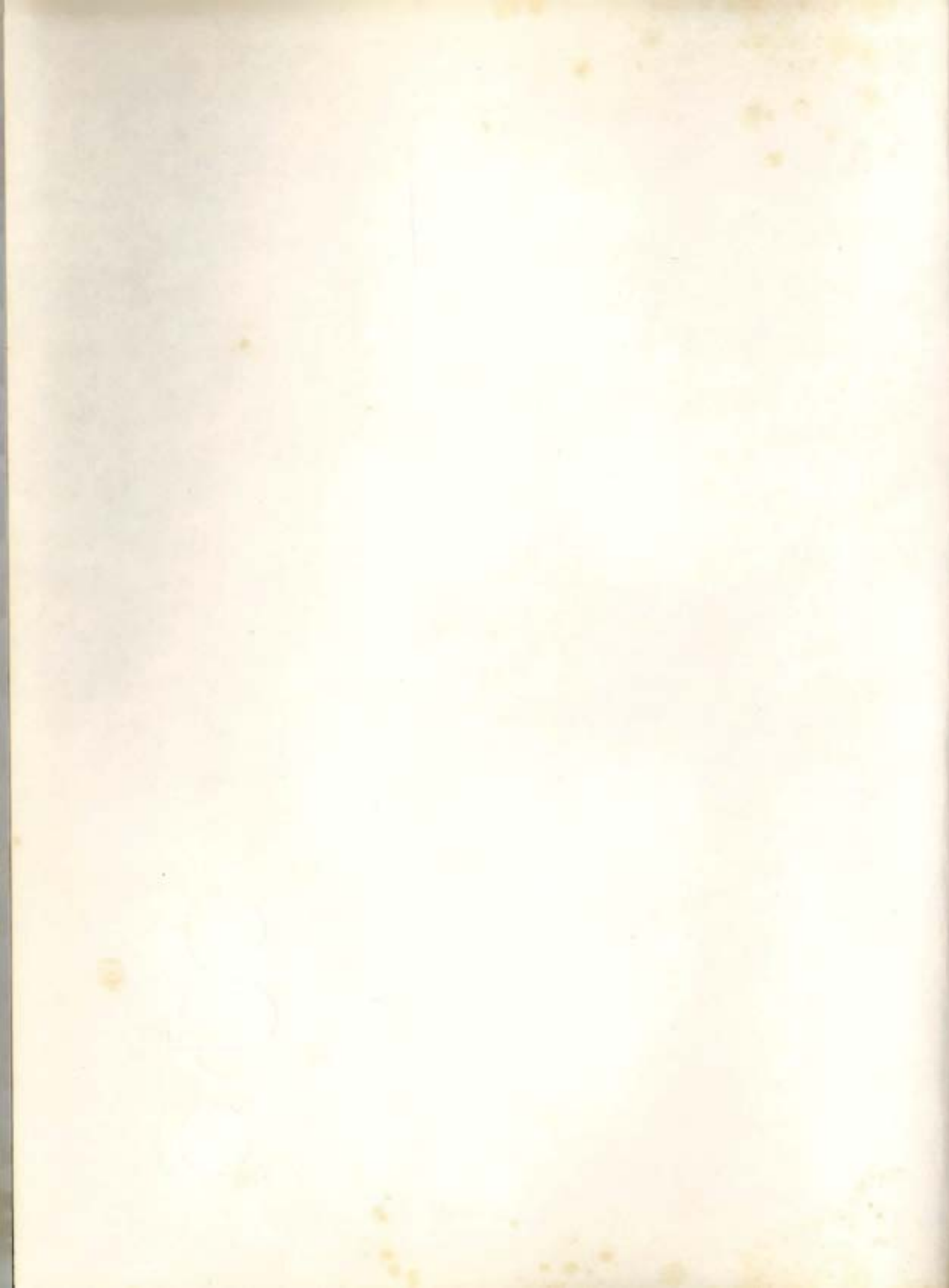

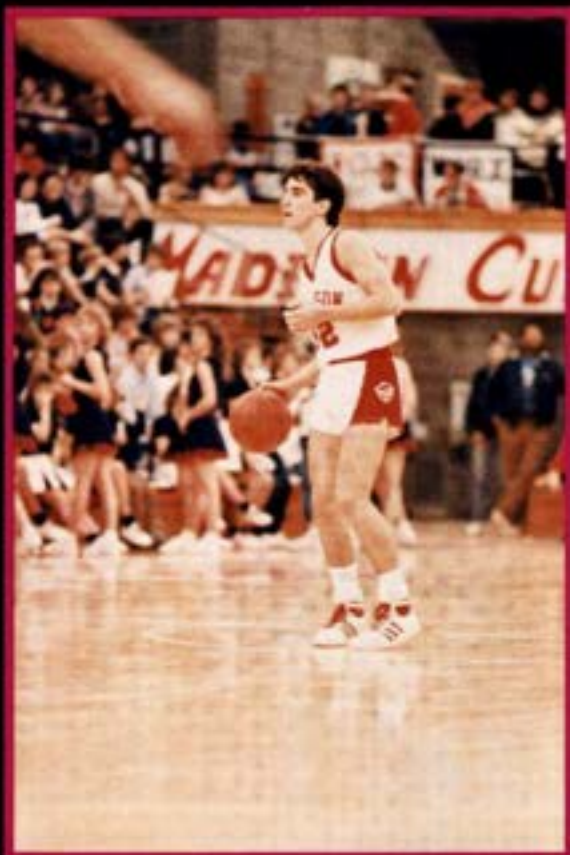

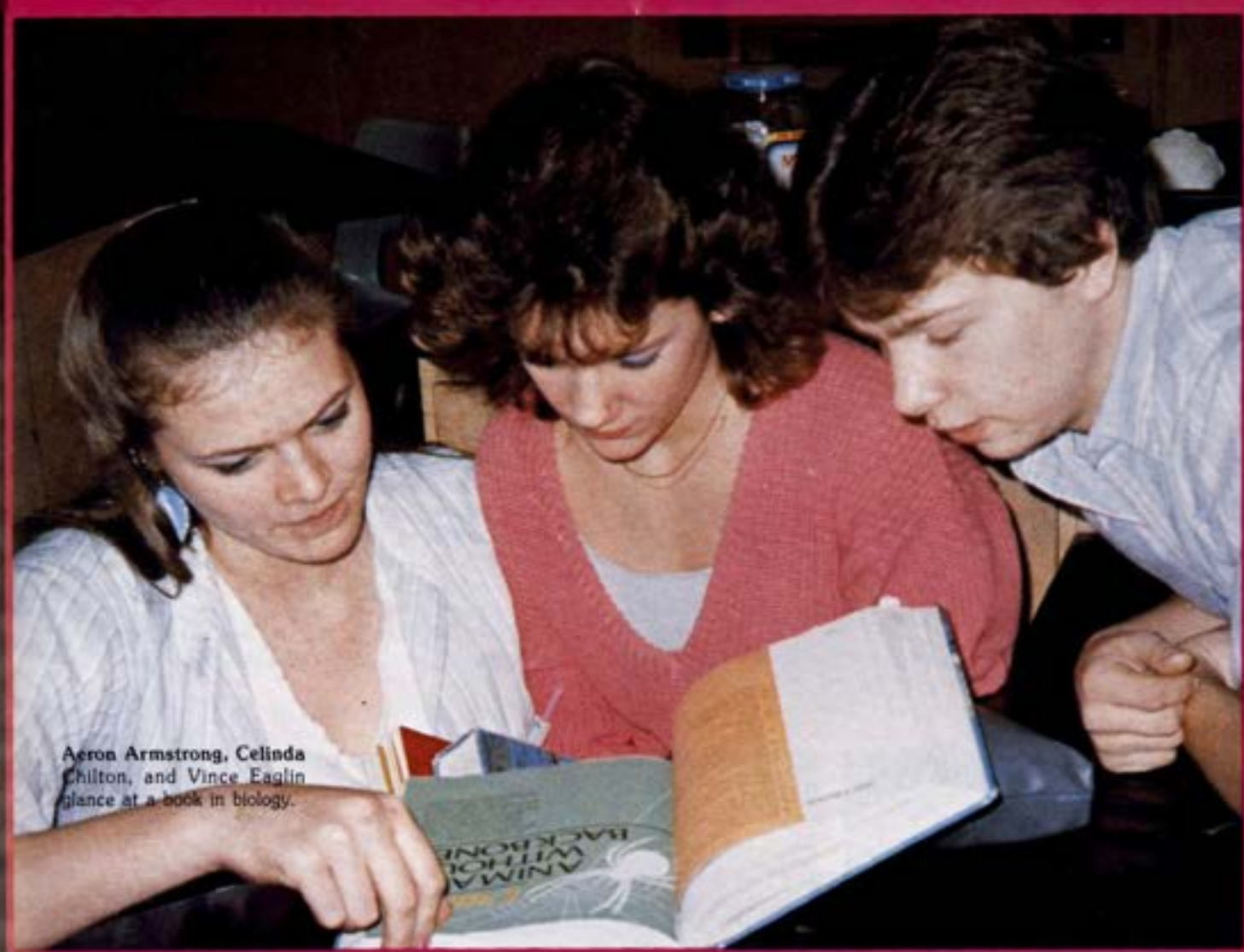

## CHANGES...

# Changes



The students at Madison Consolidated are confronted with many changes this school year, changes that break with traditions that were set many years ago and firmly embedded in the Madison School System. While the school administration had a choice in selecting either a waiver or the directives, they felt that the Madison system, especially the high school, was close enough to following the standards so that little difference would be felt in accepting and implementing them. However, as the school got under way, the cries of "What are we doing?" and "Whose idea was this?" were heard throughout the school community. Athletic contests had to be cancelled and the requirement that athletes be in class all day. In addition the student activity period took on a new look in that it was allocated twenty minutes instead of forty five minutes in the past. These rather long days with little opportunity for the much-cherished school activities were to be held twelve times during the year.

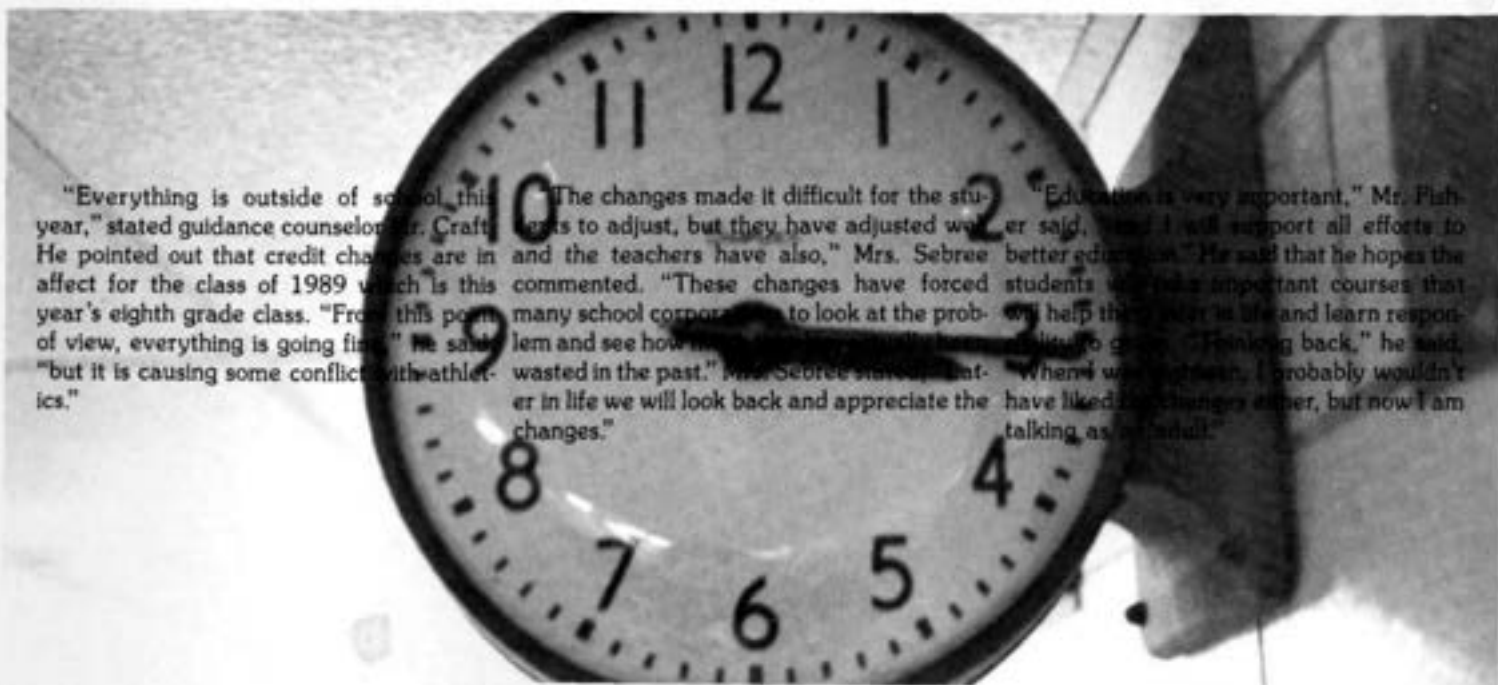
While students have expressed a willingness to try the new changes and have remained patient, the school community is evaluating the effects of those alterations. The students are feeling the immediate effects as the school alters the traditions they have become accustomed to.



"Everything is outside of school this year," stated guidance counselor Mr. Craft. He pointed out that credit changes are in affect for the class of 1989 which is this year's eighth grade class. "From this point of view, everything is going fine," he said, "but it is causing some conflict with athletics."

"The changes made it difficult for the students to adjust, but they have adjusted well and the teachers have also," Mrs. Seabee commented. "These changes have forced many school corporations to look at the problem and see how they can avoid the waste in the past." Mrs. Seabee stated, "Later in life we will look back and appreciate the changes."

"Education is very important," Mr. Fisher said, "and I will support all efforts to better education." He said that he hopes the students will take important courses that will help them later in life and learn responsibility to go. "Thinking back," he said, "When I was a student, I probably wouldn't have liked the changes either, but now I am talking as an adult."





Assistant principal, Mr. Gallatin said that basically he feels that the changes are good and will be beneficial to students, but he does disagree with a couple of details involved. "I don't like the provisions that were made to accommodate the activity periods," he stated. "I feel that it is very important for students to be involved in activities. Also, I'm not happy with the way that they have cut down on our flexibility."



New to Madison this year, Dr. Peigh stated that there are both pros and cons to the new changes. "Right now the school system is working on possibly raising the graduation requirements beyond the state's graduation requirements. If this happens, then going to a 7 period day would not only be beneficial, but necessary."



The changes don't affect every sport, but they do cause alterations in scheduling in the sports that have to be played during daylight hours which is about half of our program," stated athletic director Mr. Lee. "If we are going in this direction in the future, there's going to be a need for some flexibility."



"The changes have taken away senior privileges and freedoms that every high school student looks forward to," stated senior Wayne Detmer. "If educators would emphasize quality rather than quantity, the results would be more prolific. The new restrictions on traditional in school activities have decreased student involvement and overall, lowered school spirit."



"I don't mind the 60 minute periods, because there is more time to cover more material," stated language arts teacher Mrs. Means. "I'm not happy with the way they're handling the activities. There is too much change too fast. There needs to be a compromise."



Junior Michelle Posz commented, "This year the changes haven't affected me that much, but for some students, they have caused a lot of adjustments to be made. I had looked forward to the traditional senior privileges, but now I feel like I don't have very much to look forward to in my senior year."



"The day is too long now that we have six 60 minute periods per day," stated Mr. Caudill, head of the social studies department. "I'm glad that we're going to a seven period day next year, because I think that the student's attention span will be longer and class sizes will be smaller."



"I'd like to have a seven period day, because there would be time to take all the classes that I want and a study hall also," stated sophomore Shannon Thomas. "I would like to see some more emphasis on activities and a more regular schedule for them too."

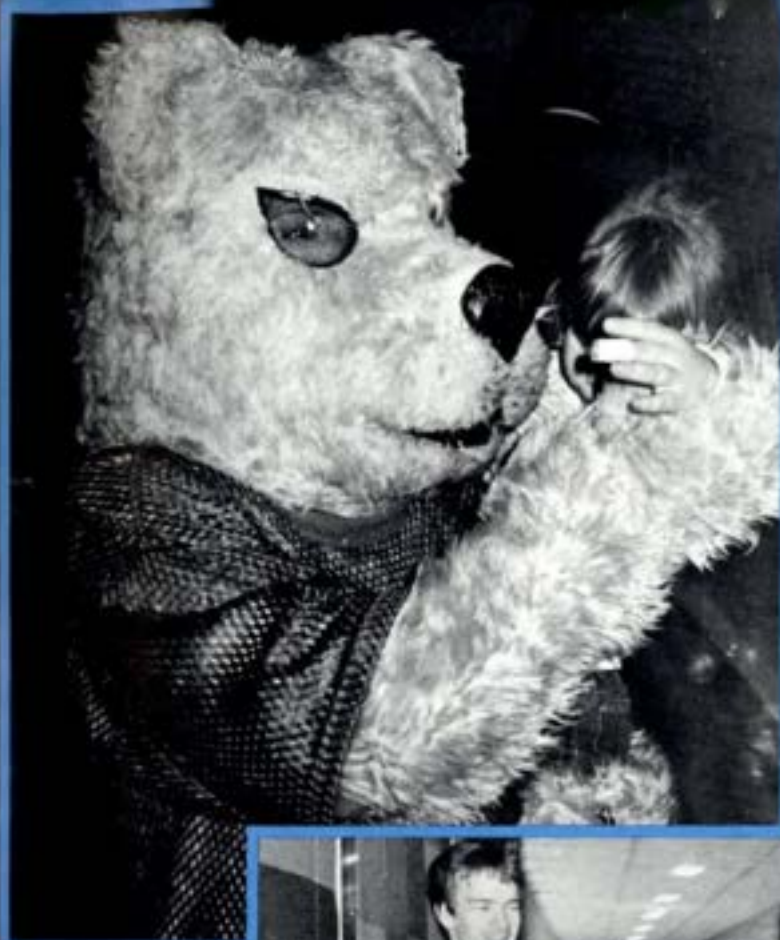

# Remember When?

In March, 1950 they were the most celebrated group in Madison. Even the Governor of Indiana joined the admirers at Madison High School's Brown Gym to pay tribute to the 1950 state champion basketball team. ... THE MADISON CUBS! In the weeks that followed, Coach Ray Eddy resigned to take the head coaching job at Purdue University, ending an 11 year period known as the Eddy Era at Madison. Eventually each of the 1950 Champs graduated to new ventures in their lives.

But Madison didn't forget. On Saturday, February 16, 1985, after 35 years, Madison High School again paid tribute to the champs. With Broadway Street's Madison High School and Brown Gym no longer the home of the Cubs, these basketball players of another era were recognized during the Madison-Seymour game in a newer, larger gymnasium named for the man who was principal at Madison High in 1950 - Conner K. Salm.

Prior to the game the Champs were honored at a banquet in the cafeteria. Seven of the eight members of that team who are still living reunited and reminisced about "The Year." Not present were Coach Ray Eddy who was visiting in California and team member Stan Weber, now the head basketball coach at Brownstown, who had a game. A moment of silence for the deceased team members, Charles Monk Browne, Dave Turner, and team manager John Weber, was observed.

Following the meal, athletic director Mr. Lee read a letter from Coach Eddy. Then each of the team members spoke about the team and the tremendous feat they captured together. Memories were refreshed as the team members recollected several humorous incidents during their soaring season. Everyone present enjoyed reminiscing with the 1950 Champs.

In conclusion, Superintendent Dr. Robert Boyd said in a salute to the Champions, "We respect the excellence these fellows left for this community. What they've given to Madison is a piece of culture."

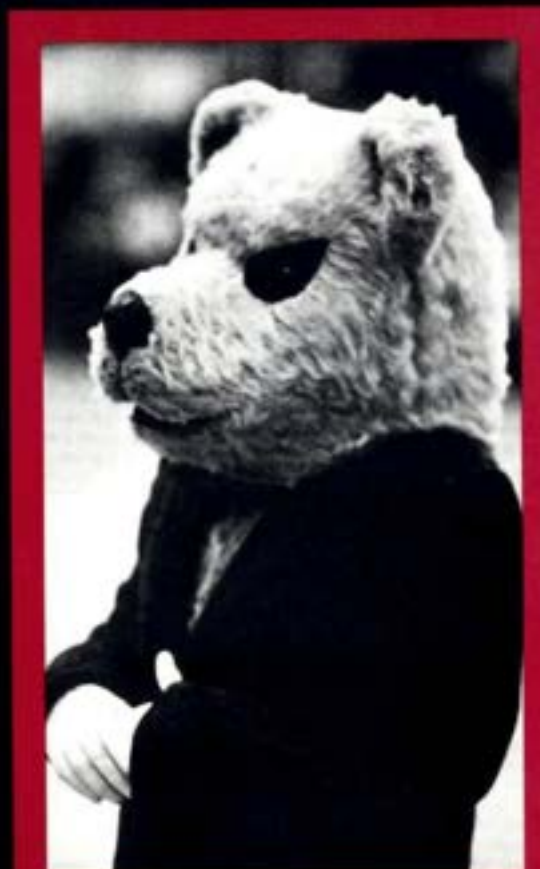

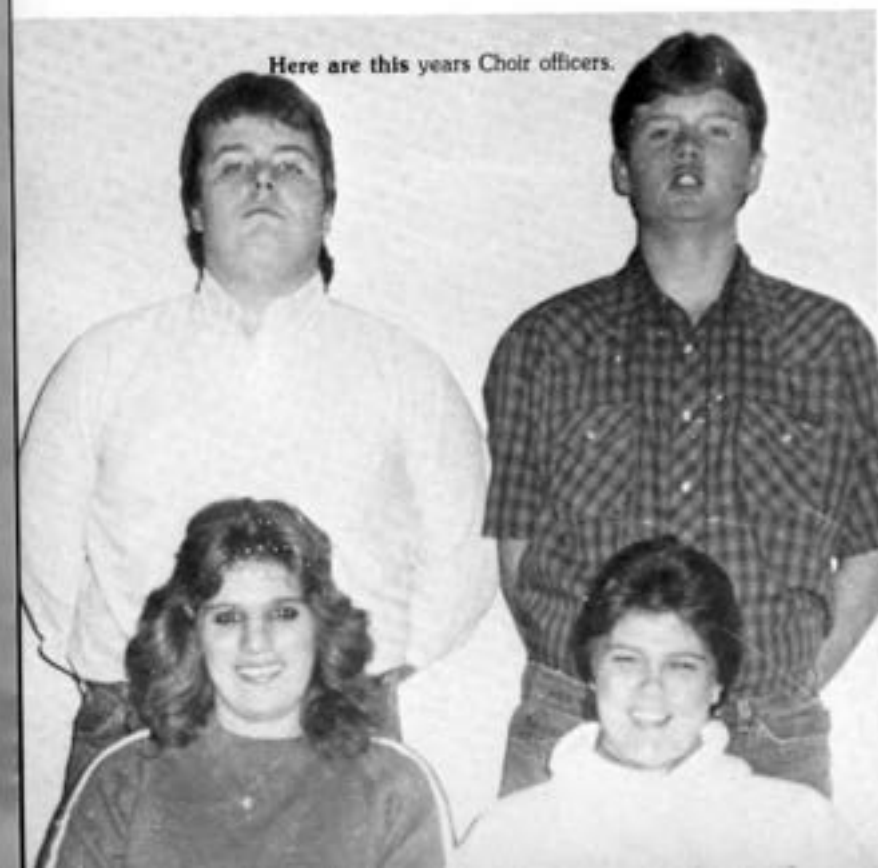



Although it was a disappointing season, the football team did end with an enthusiastic spirit. Senior David Breitweiser was named the Most Valuable Player of the varsity team. Coach Herrick called him "one of the finest high school players I've ever seen. He held our offense together and he held our defense together. He played a lot of games while injured. He gave his all." David was the only player to play both offense and defense. Breitweiser was also the Most Valuable Lineman and he and Jack Stoner received the Co-captain Award.

The Most Valuable Back award was given to Bobby Lutes, a junior. "There was no question who earned this award," Herrick said. Lutes led the team in total offense with 1,187 yards. 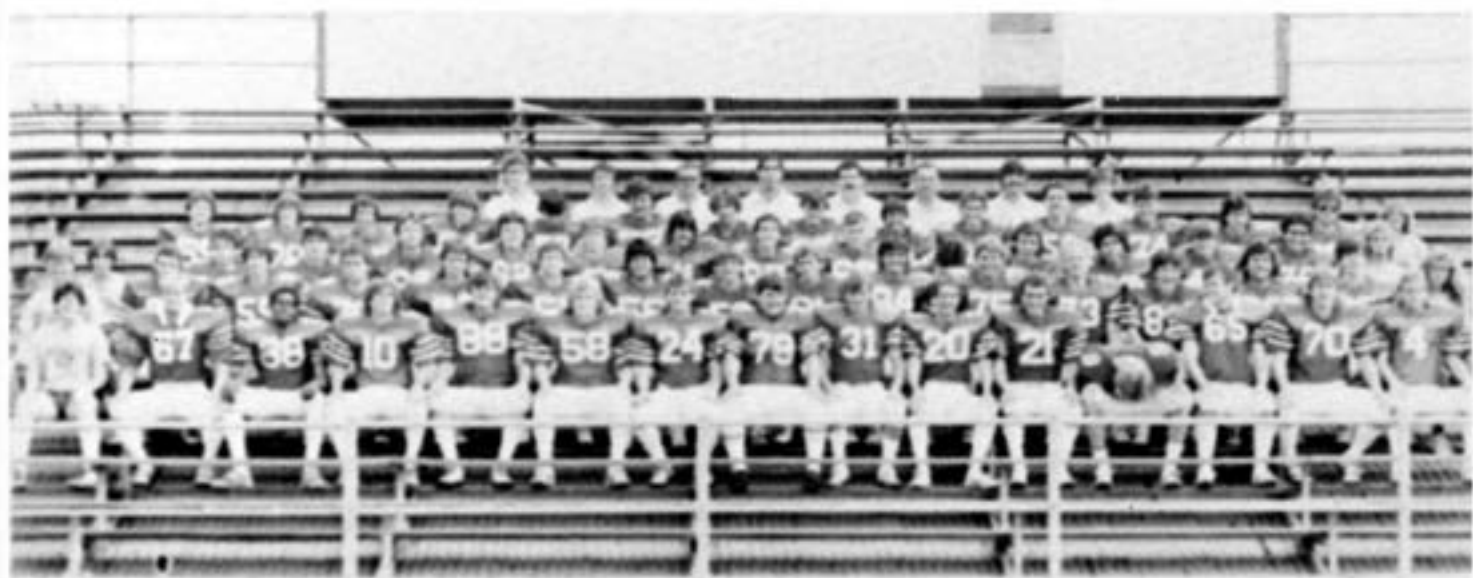

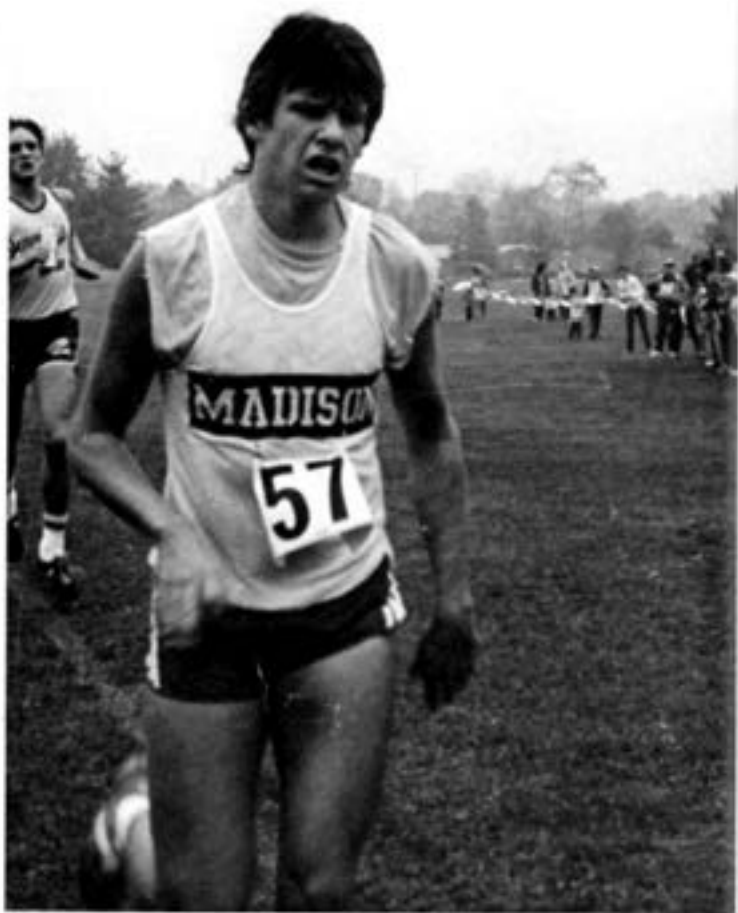

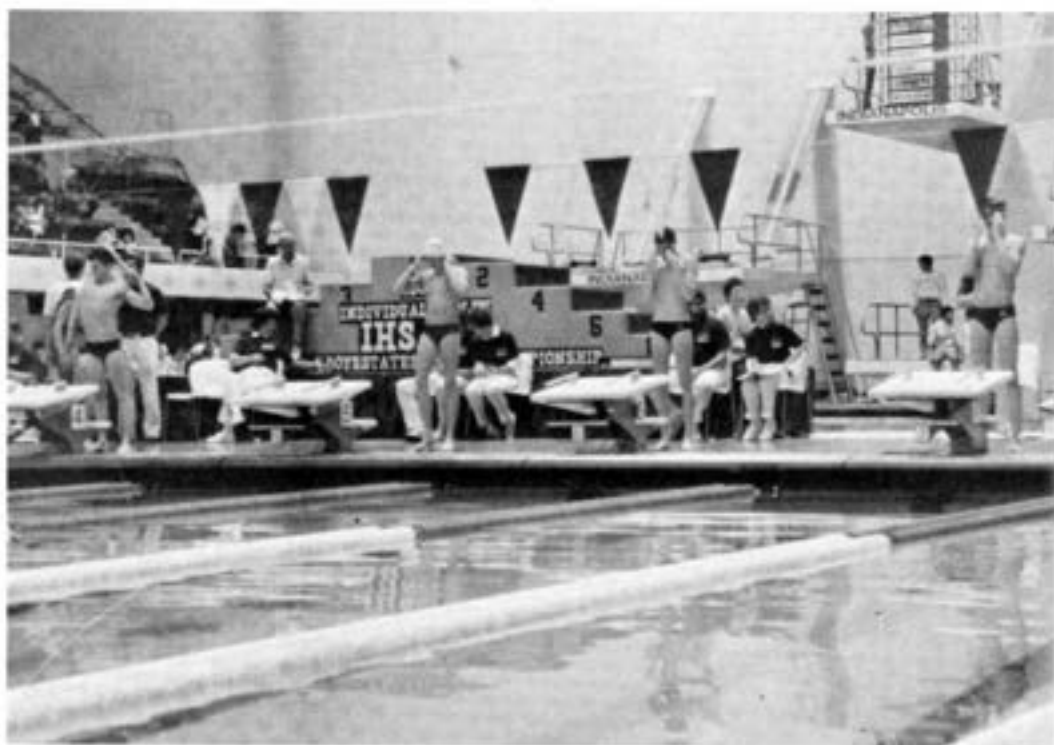
# Fish Can Swim - So Do Cubs

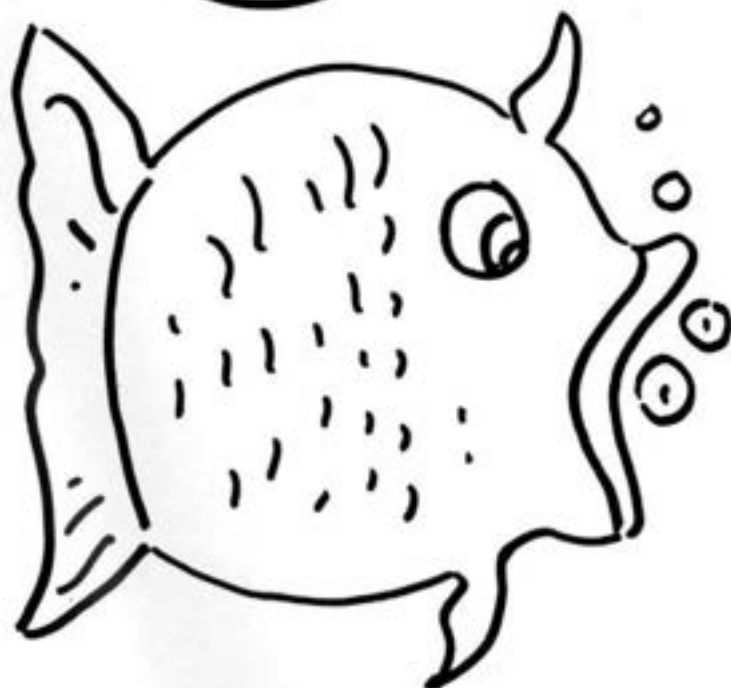
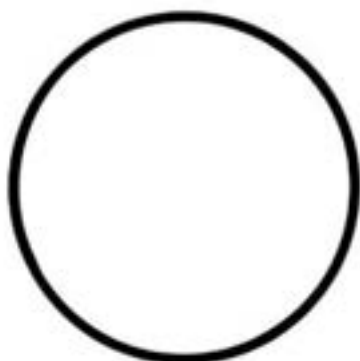

# Senior Pride Baby

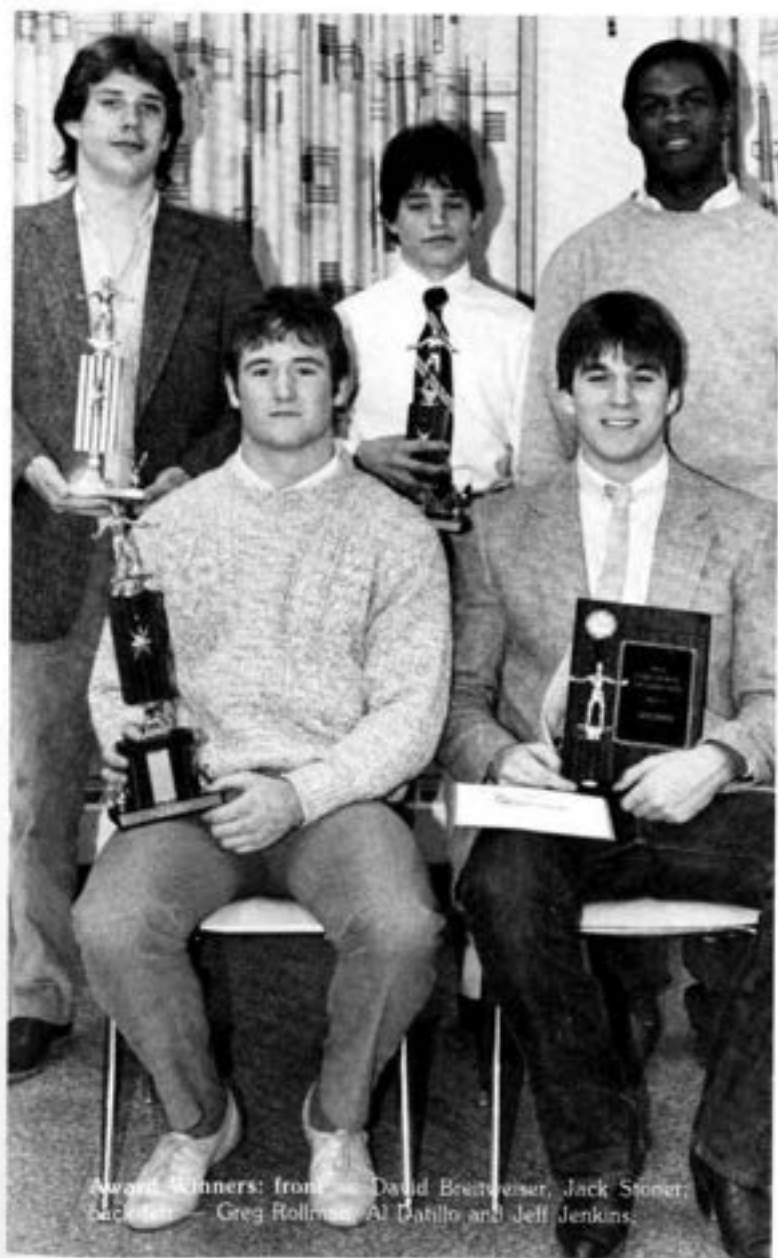

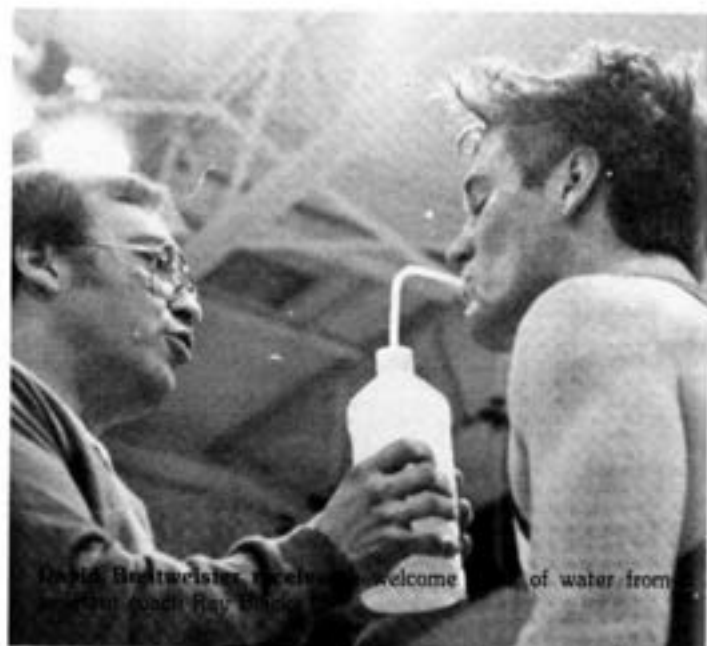

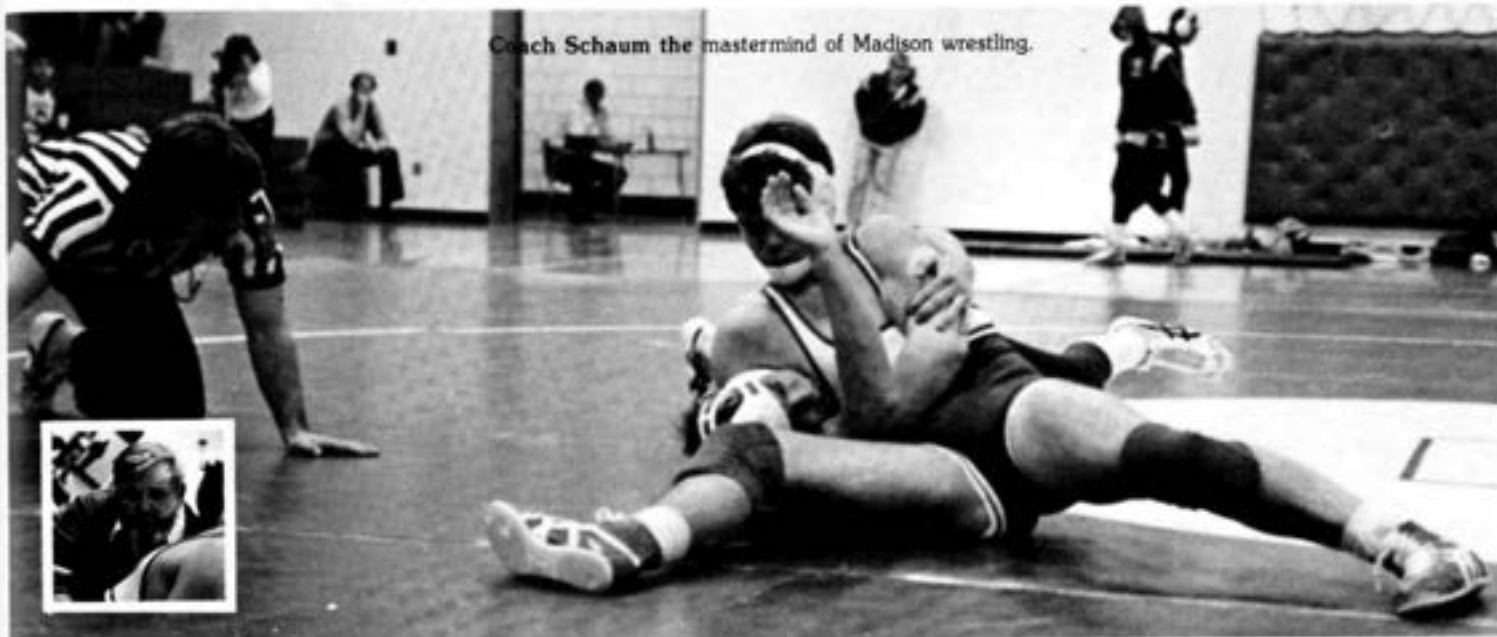

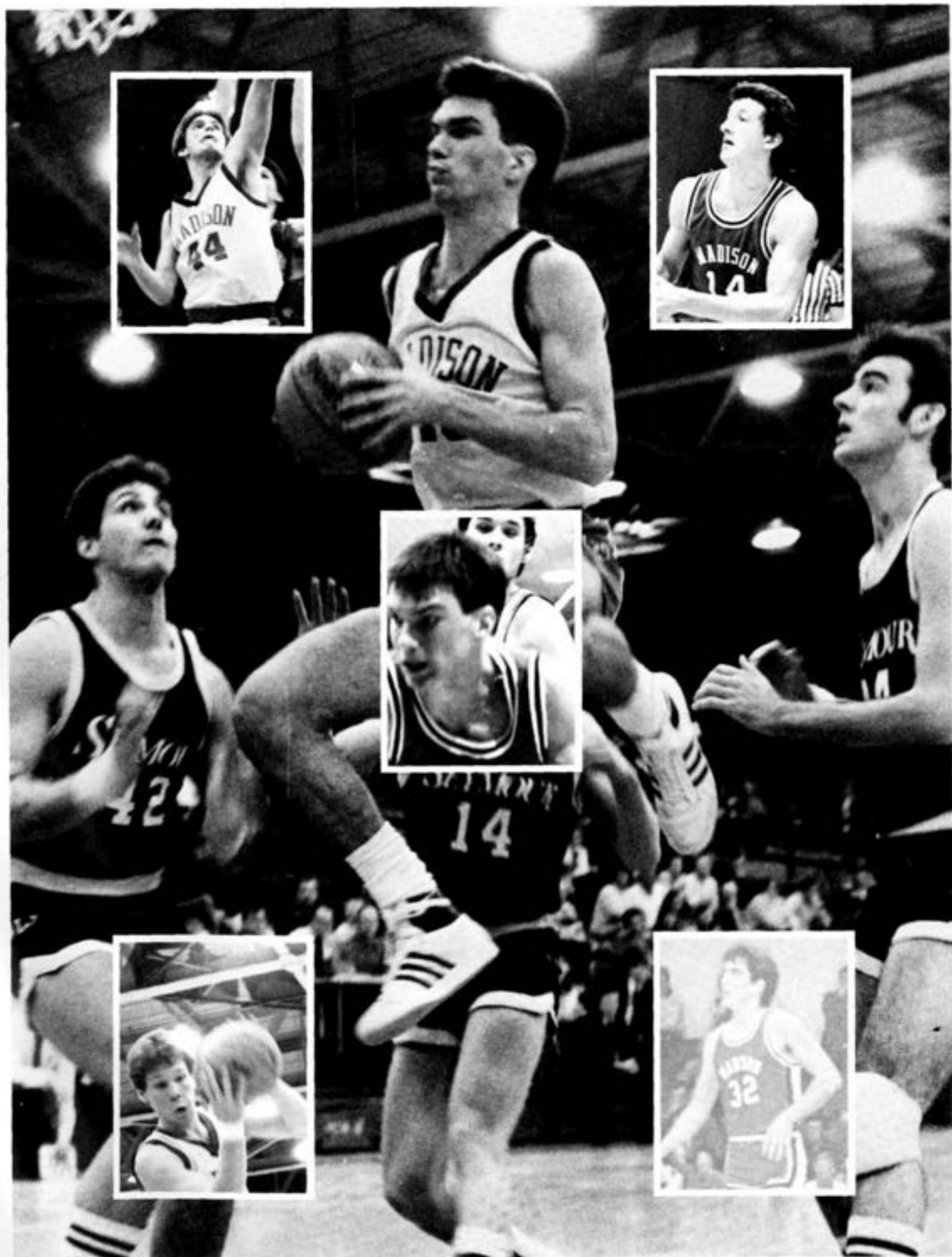

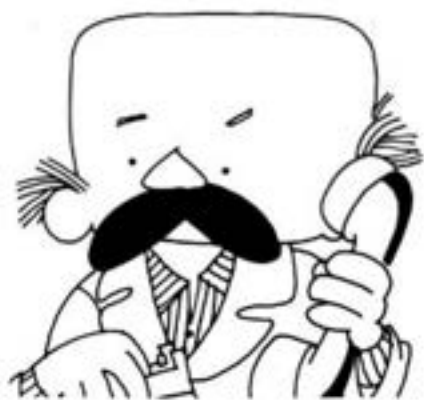

For the first time since 1978 Madison High School had to close for more than two or three days because of snow and ice. Approximately 12 days were lost this year, much to the joy of the students and to the anguish of the school administration. 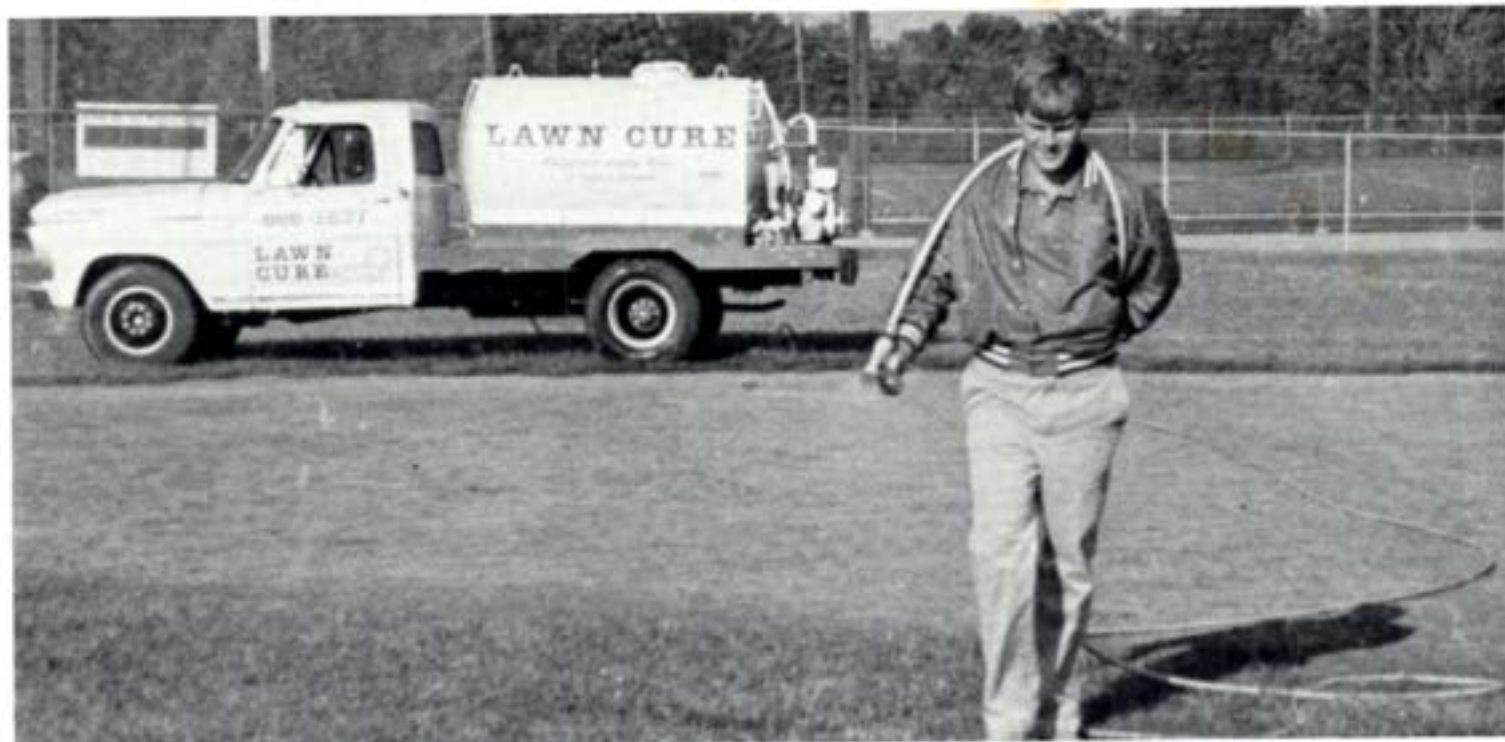
