
This Season's Competitions

Welcome to the Spring 2016 Texas A&M Crew Newsletter! The team was very busy this semester. In addition to traveling to five competitions around Texas and the country, the team purchased a new Eight Boat in March to better serve our rowers. We also finished painting the team's new trailer in Aggie Maroon.

For those parents new to the sport of rowing, there are two seasons in the sport: fall season is "Distance Season," and the races consist of 4k and 5k head races, while the spring season is "Sprint Season," and the races are 1k or 2k head-to-head sprints. Our first two competitions, SWEAT and Erg Rodeo were erg competitions, where rowers compete in 2k sprints on the ergometers (rowing machines). These competitions are a great way for veteran and new rowers alike to transition into Sprint Season and have the best time possible for boating placements. We also competed in on-the-water competitions in Austin and in Tennessee: Heart of Texas, Texas Duel and SIRA.

SWEAT *Dallas, TX*

The first competition of the season was the Southwest Ergometer Amateur Tournament (SWEAT) hosted by Jesuit College Preparatory School. This completion was only available for returning rowers due to its proximity to Contract Night. Here, we raced against teams such as Baylor and A&M Galveston. At the largest regatta in Texas, the team faced strong competition from schools such as Northwestern State, UT, A&M Galveston, and other regional schools. On Saturday, the novice boats and the Open 8-boats raced in prelims and finals. The Open Men's 8 made finals, while the Novice Men's 4 earned a bronze medal. The Novice Women earned two medals on Saturday, with a Silver medal in their 4 boat and a Bronze in their 8 boat.

On Sunday, only the Open Men and Women's 4 boats raced. Here, both boats made finals, with the Men's Open 4 finishing 4th and the Women's Open 4 finishing 6th.

Southeast Intercollegiate

Rowing Association Championship (SIRA)

Oak Ridge, TN

Each spring the team brings one boat from each of the four categories to compete at the SIRA Regatta in Oak Ridge, TN. Bringing in teams from the Southeast such as Alabama, University of Virginia, Florida, and more, this regatta is the most competitive of the season. On the first day of time trials, the Open and Novice Women's 4 boats placed into semifinals, which is the top 18 boats. The Open Men's 4 was placed into D finals and the Novice Men's 8 into E

finals. In the Semifinals, the Novice Women placed into B finals, while the Open Women's 4 placed into C finals.

In the Finals on Sunday, the Open Women finished 2nd in C Finals, and the Novice Women's 8 finished 3rd in B finals. These two boats showcased how the team has benefited from the expanded women's roster we have seen over the past year.
