

JACKALOPE: KNITTING KIT FOR MEN



OVERVIEW

Jackalope is a starter knitting kit that targets men between the ages of 18–35. This product includes all of the tools and instructions necessary for someone interested in the craft to knit their own cap, scarf, or set of gloves.

CHALLENGE

Men have been knitting for centuries—not as a frivolous hobby, but as a means of constructing practical garments and household necessities. In the postwar era, however, knitting became associated almost exclusively as a female-dominated activity, causing males to distance themselves from the craft. While many men today are interested in knitting, they are often discouraged by the branding and iconography that dominate the market and reinforce the perception that the craft is a "ladies-only" affair. As such, male knitters are an overlooked consumer group when they may very well be a lucrative niche market.

SOLUTION

Jackalope intentionally differentiates itself from competing products by offering a design that is masculine without being patronizing. The classic and rugged aesthetic of the starter kit is reminiscent of vintage camping, fishing, and survival gear. Sturdy waxed canvas and attractive leather detailing allow the Jackalope kit to look equally at home on a workbench as it would on a bachelor's coffee table. No-nonsense directions and high-quality tools give crafters a starting point for several projects that encourage the construction of practical goods and future exploration into the art form.

KIT CONSTRUCTION

Due to my utter lack of sewing skills and experience, my first prototype was incredibly crude. I used cheap muslin for my fabric and stapled it together. It wasn't much to look at, but it did help me figure out the logistics of scale, dimension, and functionality.

Rather than hire a seamstress to construct my final package, I decided to spend my money on a sewing machine and teach myself the basics. I was so intimidated by this complicated machinery that it took me more than 24 hours before I worked up the nerve to even turn the thing on. Several youtube videos later and I finally figured out how to thread my machine.

After a bit of practice, I started to gain some confidence in my sewing techniques. Eventually I was even able to achieve straight lines in my stitching. I constructed a second prototype out of muslin so that I could work out all of the kinks before moving on to canvas.

Once I was sure about the dimensions of my kit, I cut out a pattern of all the pieces using box board. Then I traced each piece of my pattern onto canvas fabric and used a rotary cutter to cut them out. I quickly realized that sewing canvas is a lot trickier than muslin. Achieving the correct tension in my thread and getting straight lines proved to be a nightmare.

I completed a third prototype out of canvas fabric, but just wasn't satisfied with the quality of the stitching and construction. So I made one more canvas prototype which, thankfully, became my final package. Once it was complete, I took a bar of Otter brand fabric wax and rubbed it into the canvas. I then turned my attention to leather craft and learned how to punch holes, shave thinner pieces, and apply rivets, snaps, and buckles. Afterwards, I made chromatech dry rub-downs of my logo and applied them to my leather.


