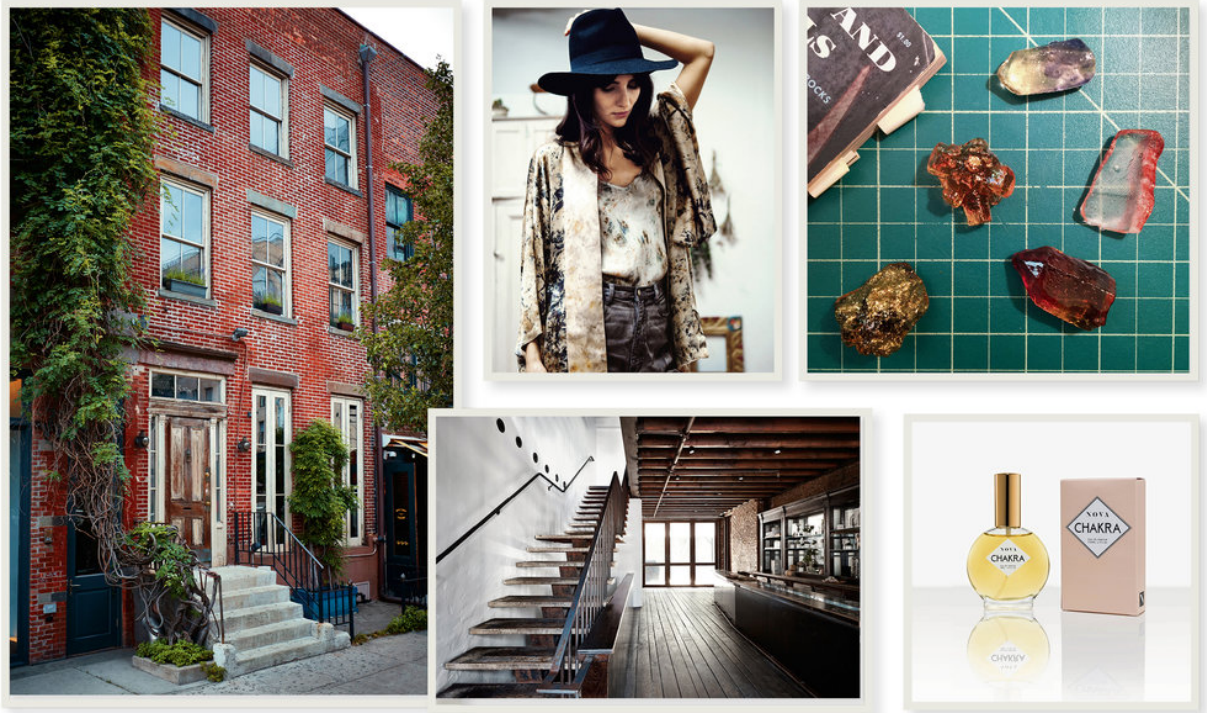

Fort Gansevoort, a Space for Artisans, Also Serves Barbecue

Fort Gansevoort, a new experimental gallery, shopping destination and barbecue joint (yes!) in the meatpacking district, will be home to a rotating series of stylish artisans who will be making and selling their creations there. Each artist will have a space on one of the three floors of the Greek Revival rowhouse that used to house the restaurant 5 Ninth. Adam Shopkorn, the founder of the gallery, called S, M, L. (referring to the bars in the former restaurant), said that it would “enable people making their craft out of their bathtub to come in here and create.” The first group of artisans to create, sell and host workshops in the space includes Julia Zangrill, a perfumer who makes custom scents; the candy maker Maayan Zilberman of Sweet Saba, who will be running a sugar crystal shop; and Cara Marie Piazza, a textile designer who works with natural dyes.

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
