
The Green Review

What is Photoperiod?

There are three main lengths of photoperiod. The first is <u>short day</u>, which requires that the day length be shorter than a certain number of hours in order for a flower to bloom. Examples of this would be cosmos, celosia and zinnia.

Then there are <u>day neutral</u> flowers that will flower whenever they are mature



The plants response to day length can vary greatly. It is important for greenhouse growers to know the photoperiod of their plants. This allows them to micromanage the light around the plants to induce flowering, meaning they can plant, grow and harvest flowers of all varieties year-round. This micromanagement includes using shade cloths during the summer or lights during the winter depending on the season.

Meade County 4-H Leaders Association September 27, 2010

The Meade County 4-H Leaders Association met on September 27, 2010 at the Meade County Extension Office. President Jamie Hockenbary called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM. Bernice Lemmel led the Pledge of Allegiance and Eris Tanner led the 4-H Pledge.

Minutes: Ronda Snyder read the secretary's report which was approved as read.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> No report. Leaders expressed concern of not having a regular report. Eris Tanner made a motion that three names (President, Vice-president, Treasurer) be listed on the Leader's Association bank account and that at least two signatures be required on each check. Allison Roberts seconded; motion carried.

Eris made a motion that the bank be notified requesting that the financial statement be sent to the Extension Office where copies will be made for the appropriate people. Robin Strain seconded; motion carried.

Old Business:

*4-H Achievement Days went well. Static exhibits increased slightly while the animal exhibits decreased. Rebecca Poelstra mentioned that it is uncertain yet how the School District's present control of the Votech building will affect the future fair.

New Business:

*Start of the new 4-H Year: Recently, the Meade County 4-H Program was involved in a Civil Rights Audit. Results of the audit have dictated a need to revise of some of the forms, such as the enrollment form, the 4-H volunteer form and the Code of Conduct. The state office is working on the new forms and they are not yet available. Club leaders are advised to start the new year as usual, get names and addresses of new members so they will begin receiving the newsletter. New forms will be distributed as soon as they are available.

*The revised 4-H Volunteer forms/program will include a fee for background checks and require that more than one volunteer be present at events and activities. More information will be forthcoming.

*State 4-H Leaders: No report.

- *Fundraising Opportunities: Rebecca prepared samples of Pastry Puffins and Butter Braid. Fundraising information was shared with the leaders.
- *4-H Promotion and Expansion Committee for Meade County: As a result of the Civil Rights Audit a committee is needed to evaluate the 4-H program to determine enrollment numbers, individuals and groups being reached, individuals and groups not being reached but should be. The committee will

consist of 6-7 adults and youth with half of the committee not being 4-H related. The committee will meet 3-4 times annually. Rebecca is working on committee selection.

*Club Visits: Rebecca would like to visit 4-H clubs. She shared a list of topics that she could present.

*Photography Calendar: The 4-H Photography Calendar is available again for \$5.00. Deadline for ordering is September 30th.

*Nomination Committee for Vice President and Treasurer: Liane Schmit made a motion to submit information to the 4-H Newsletter concerning the leader officer positions open for election. Candace seconded; motion carried.

*Recognition Event: Following the rotation schedule, the recognition event should be held in Union Center, however, after a lengthy discussion, it was decided to have the event in Sturgis. Various foods left from the Junior Leader food stands will be served in addition to bars and cookies donated by the leaders and families. The event will be Sunday, November 7th at 1:00 PM at the Extension Office.

4-Her Recognition—Awards & Trophies: Rebecca noted that with the present system of awards & trophies, **very few members are eligible. A serious decision needs to be made to change the guidelines so more members can receive these awards.

Sturgis Regional Senior Care Unit Trick or Treat Night: Volunteers, both youth and adult, are needed to assist the residents in handing out candy for their Trick or Treat Night on Halloween between 5 PM and 6:30 PM. Donations of both candy and money will be accepted. The Junior Leaders will be considering this as a community service activity.

*Western 4-H FCS Show will be October 8-9. Events are planned for Cloverbuds, 4-H members and non-4-H members.

*Western Junior Livestock Show will be October 6-9. Both events coincide with National 4-H Week which is October 3-9.

*4-H Event Dates for the 2011 Handbook are due to the Extension Office by December 1, 2010.

Seeing no further business, Jamie adjourned the meeting.
