Taking Livestock to the SD State Fair

Any 4-Her who may show livestock at the SD State Fair must complete the 4-H Livestock Ownership Affidavits for each species. In addition, livestock must be tagged with a green tag provided by the Extension Office, and market animals must be weighed by the Extension Office prior to the dates below. If you are leasing the animal, a Lease Form also needs to be completed along with the Ownership Affidavits. All forms are available at the Extension Office. Ownership deadlines for 2011:

- April 1, 2011 Market Beef
 - June 1, 2011 Market Sheep, Breeding Sheep, Breeding Beef, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, and Market Swine
- July 1, 2011 Rabbits and Poultry
 - o Green tags and weighing not required
 - Poultry need Leg Bands
 - (one per bird)

 Rabbits need to be tattooed (one per rabbit)

If you do not have the required paper work completed, the animal is not green tagged or the animal is not weighed by the deadline above; you are not eligible to show at the SD State Fair.

Anyone who may show market swine at the SD State Fair must be Youth Pork Quality Assurance



Certified (YPQA). The SD State Fair is a terminal show, as all hogs are sent to John Morrell, who requires PQA

certification. Contact Penny at the Extension Office to learn how to become certified. Certifications must be obtained by **June 1, 2011**.

*4-H Camp: Camp dates are not final yet. Meade County will likely need chaperones this year.

How do you choose the perfect site for your vegetable garden?

A simple definition of a vegetable is a food we obtain from the leaves, stems, roots or tubers of plants. Fruits are the product of a ripened ovary, so botanically speaking tomatoes or peppers are fruit. You may find that you like different vegetables if you grow them yourself. When starting your garden, site selection is very important. One thing to consider for your site is the amount of sunlight it will receive. Also what time of day the sunlight is shining on your plants. For plants that bear fruit like tomatoes and sweet peas your site should get at least 6 hrs of sunlight a day. Try to keep your plants out of the drip line of trees and shrubs. If your site is partially shaded it is better for the plants to get the morning sun this will dry their leaves faster and reduce the chances or disease and certain pests. A more shaded garden is good for growing leafy crops like spinach and root crops like beets. If you don't have enough space for a large garden try planting your vegetables with your ornamental plants this is called edible landscaping. Even if you don't have a yard you can plant herbs in your window. Everyone can choose the perfect site for their garden!
