



#### *Spies of the Balkans* by Alan Furst

Alan Furst is a master writer of historical spy thrillers. His novels are set in Europe roughly from 1933 to 1945, against the backdrop of Hitler's rise to power. Furst brilliantly evokes the atmosphere of that fraught time in European history.

*Spies of the Balkans* is set in the winter of 1940-41 in Salonika, in northern Greece. Greece is threatened by the Axis powers. Having driven the Italians back through Albania, the Greeks expect Hitler will soon invade. In Salonika, an exotic port, Costa Zannis is a police detective who becomes involved with helping Jewish refugees escape from Germany. Along the way he also becomes involved with several ladies. The plot moves quickly to its conclusion. Check out the Friends of the Library bookstore for this and other Alan Furst novels.
