
**ABQ Trio**


There will be free refreshments and Japanese food truck items for purchase. Students from our Sister City, Amakusa, will be visiting and attending the event.




Do you ever wonder where the Encinitas Library bookstore gets all its marvelous books, CDs and DVDs? Over the last two months, we have received two extraordinary donations, which illustrate nicely how donations are given and how they are used by the volunteers that run the bookstore.

**B** The first donation, in April, came to us because the donor's husband had known the husband of one of our volunteers. Our volunteer had told her about our bookstore and the amazing amount of money it raises for the Encinitas Library. Since she was moving to a much smaller house, the donor decided to gift us with almost all of her book collection. Once packed, it came to 140 medium moving boxes! This is the largest donation the bookstore has ever received. It took four people, two cars and a pickup truck (two visits for the truck) to collect all the boxes. They were all taken to the home of one of our sorters, and sorted over the next three weeks. As a result, the bookstore had a special offering of great science books for one month.

**O** In May, a retired artist from South America called because he was friends with one of the librarians, and she had told him about the bookstore and the money it raised to enhance the Encinitas Library in so many ways. He gave us two car loads of Latin American art books and some interesting non-fiction books. We added those art books to some from the April donation and have had art books out during May in a prominent place in the bookstore.

**N** In addition, many people just drop in any day the bookstore is open and donate a few books, a bag of books, a box of books, or sometimes two or three boxes. It is truly a constant flow of new material to the bookstore. If you ever want to add to the bookstore stock, please feel free to donate nice quality books, DVDs and CDs. We are able to give a San Diego County Library letter of acknowledgement that can be used for tax purposes. All 70 of the volunteers in the bookstore appreciate the consistent support of the community, and are delighted to see our library benefit from your generosity.

Michael Lewis, the author of "Moneyball," "The Blind Side," and "The Big Short" is back again, this time with a biography of two Israeli psychologists, Amos Tversky and Danny Kahneman, entitled "The Undoing Project: A Friendship that Changed Our Minds." Their pioneering work in how people make decisions completely upended economists' belief in a rational human mind. In addition to economics, their discoveries have important applications in medicine, both with regard to medical diagnosis and patient behavior. But this book is more than just a discussion of psychology. It goes deeply into the complex relationship of these two pioneers. Mr. Lewis is able to explain their theories with sophistication and clarity while telling a wonderful and entertaining story. The book is available for sale in the Friends' bookstore and is currently on the Hot Right Now shelf in the Encinitas library.
