COVID-19 PROTOCOLS- **UPDATED 5/19/21**

As information continues to change, almost daily, we will adapt and adjust our protocols and procedures as we follow guidance provided by the CDC and local health officials.

We desire to serve God by restoring substandard housing through the use of volunteer teens and adults. Health and safety are our top priorities for our homeowners, our volunteers, and our staff. Though we cannot eliminate all risks, Blueprint is focused on taking all reasonable measures to reduce the risk of spreading Covid-19. The protocols and procedures we have enacted will be updated as conditions change to reflect the most recent CDC and local health officials' recommendations.

Fully vaccinated teen and adult volunteers will not be required to wear a mask or social distance while participating in Blueprint's summer camps. To receive this exemption to Blueprint's Covid-19 protocols, volunteers must present a PRINTED copy of their vaccination record at Sunday check-in.

Fully vaccinated will be defined as:

- 2 weeks after the second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

If you don't meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are NOT fully vaccinated and must follow the protocol for mask wearing and social distancing.

Here are the basics for our 2021 summer camps:

Pre-arrival Symptom Check:

- All volunteers, teens and adults, will be asked to track and self-screen for 14 days prior to participation in camp. **Those exhibiting symptoms or positive diagnosis must stay home until fully recovered.** (see "Self-Screening Form")
- Daily symptom checks will be conducted before volunteers leave for the job sites. Those exhibiting symptoms will need to enter isolation.
- Those who have traveled outside of the state of Texas or are coming from out of state to participate will need to have proof of a negative Covid-19 test three days before camps starts or proof of vaccination or a doctor's note of recovery from the Covid-19 virus.
- **Fully vaccinated volunteers, teens and adults, need only bring a copy of their vaccination record attached to the self-screening form.**

Limited Capacity and Facility Safety:

- Blueprint will operate our summer camps at reduced capacity. When weeks exceed our reduced capacity level, Blueprint will be utilizing a second site for overflow allowing all our registered participants to attend camp. The Camp Director will be communicating with any group being asked to assist in this safety measure.
- Blueprint has installed the Air Scrubber by Aerus on all our air conditioning systems to include the dining hall, sleeping areas, bathrooms and shower areas, gathering room, and chapel area.
- Daily chores will encourage a cleaner living space.
- Increased frequency measures for things such as wiping down common touch points, dining hall areas, and shared use tools will occur.

Social Distancing and Masks

- All non-vaccinated and not yet fully vaccinated participants will be expected to wear masks inside the facility except when seated for meals, showering, and sleeping.
- **Participants will not be required to wear masks when working or playing out of doors whether they are vaccinated or not.**

Exterior Work Prioritized and Worksite Safety

- Work projects will be limited to exterior work unless interior work can be accomplished safely. Presently, we only plan to work on exterior projects.
- Volunteers will not enter the homes being restored unless absolutely necessary.
- Each volunteer must bring their own safety equipment and tools (to include masks, gloves, eye protection, hammer and painting supplies). *Please see Camper "What to Bring" list.*
- Shared tools, such as power saws and drills, will be frequently cleaned.
- Mask use at each worksite will be determined by Construction or Camp Director.

Wash and Sanitize Frequently

- All participants will be asked to wash their hands frequently and use hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available.
- Blueprint will set up hand-washing stations at each of the work sites. Volunteers should bring hand sanitizers for use during travel and on the worksite. *(See Team Packing List)*
- Hand sanitizers will be available throughout the Blueprint facilities located in each dormitory, the bathrooms, dining hall, entrances, and exits.

Food Service and Snacks

- Social distanced seating will occur during mealtimes.
- Food service teams will prepare and serve food with gloves and masks.
- Food will be plated or served in individual containers.
- Food service teams will prepare, and pack all campers' lunches.
- Tables will be cleaned and sanitized by food service volunteers.
- Disposable, individually wrapped plastic ware, and single-use items will be utilized.

Sleeping

- Sleeping areas will follow CDC recommended distance of 6 feet between participants.
- Participants will be asked to sleep head to toe according to signage on bunks.

Flexibility and Mutual Upbuilding

- Blueprint is working diligently to offer the very best experience for each participant and offer an environment that provides for a safe, joy-filled experience.
- We ask for volunteers and staff to commit to flexibility as we navigate these unprecedented times.
- We invite all participants to show kindness and encouragement to each other and respect that everyone's comfort level may differ during these times.
