Christmas Message from Fr. Michael

Peace be with you! May the Infant Jesus be born again in your hearts and in the hearts of all your loved ones.

This last year has seen many amazing events, practical and spiritual in the life of this our Parish which is consistently, 2,000 strong in parishioners and Mass-goers. We have seen the numbers increase in recent years and over recent blessed occasions such as the Padre Pio weekend, the Visitation of the National Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima, the additional Masses to seek the intercession of the Saints together with important Feast occasions such as Divine Mercy Sunday. These, and the many other occasions of prayer together with our regular devotions, like the Rosary and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, have brought countless spiritual benefits to the Parish community and we thank God unceasingly and Our Lady, the Mother of our Parish, to whose Immaculate Heart this Parish was earlier this year, along with our three parish schools, consecrated.

Days rich in blessings! We have had many infant and toddler Baptisms. A wonderful number of children for First Holy Communion and First Confession. Many of our young people became soldiers for Christ when they received the Sacrament of Confirmation. We have been delighted by the numbers for the Sacrament of Marriage and we have prepared them for marriages both here in the Parish and overseas. We continue to pray for their peaceful rest and assure those who grieve, of our prayers and sympathetic support.

Our prayers were answered when the set-backs with our Parish Centre, were overcome with the policy paying out and the remedial works getting underway swiftly so that we could actually start to use it. I'm sure you'll agree, that it is a very pleasing venue giving us lots of activity and space for parish life and helping out with Deanery and Diocesan events. There is still some work to do, so please bear with us!

Our Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Council and Youth Council are now starting to take shape with their contributions becoming evident as we all walk towards "Our Parish, Our Future". Part of this is our schools with whom we have a good relationship. Congratulations to the students and staff and all the school communities who have gone from strength to strength; we continue to pray for their ongoing success.

This is also a chance to thank each and everyone of you for the contributions you make to the running of the Parish, from the very practical to the Liturgical. I thank you for your prayers, kindness and support for me and my fellow clergy, Fr. Celestine, Fr. Mark and Deacon Vincent, whose help, wisdom and support, I am grateful for.

I want us to move into 2018 together. It will be another year of grace and blessing with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in Liverpool – "Adoremus" and the Holy Father's visit to Dublin for the World Meeting of Families. These two very important events in the life of the Church in the UK, will be celebrated in the heart of our own Parish Mission. From 17th March, the Redemptiorists will lead us in a week-long Mission as we celebrate in unity, the special events of the year.

May the Lord bless your life on earth. May it make a difference to many. May your witness to the one true Faith open the doors of the Heart of Divine Mercy to bless you, strengthen you, encourage you.
