Paper Based Solutions

1 Word Wasps & Hornet Literacy Primer

WASP stands for **Word Articulation Spelling and Pronunciation**. The Word Wasp is a comprehensive programme beginning with basic letter sounds before progressing to more complex diphthongs and digraphs. It can be used with students from the age of **seven** to **adult**.

These are manuals for teaching literacy skills: both reading and spelling. They can be used by anyone.

They are proven to work and are an extremely cost-effective resource.

2 Toe by Toe



This is a highly structured, multi-sensory reading manual for teachers and parents.

Toe by Toe supports any child or adult who has difficulty in **decoding** (ie, reading unfamiliar words confidently and accurately) or reading fluently (ie, reading without pausing or hesitating when confronted by an unfamiliar word).

Both these paper based programmes of study are ideal for those who are not trained specifically to help dyslexics or to teach reading, as they guide learners through a structured tailored programme.

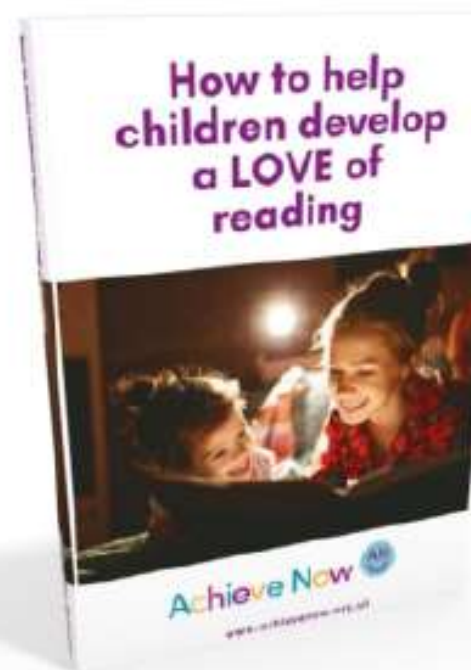

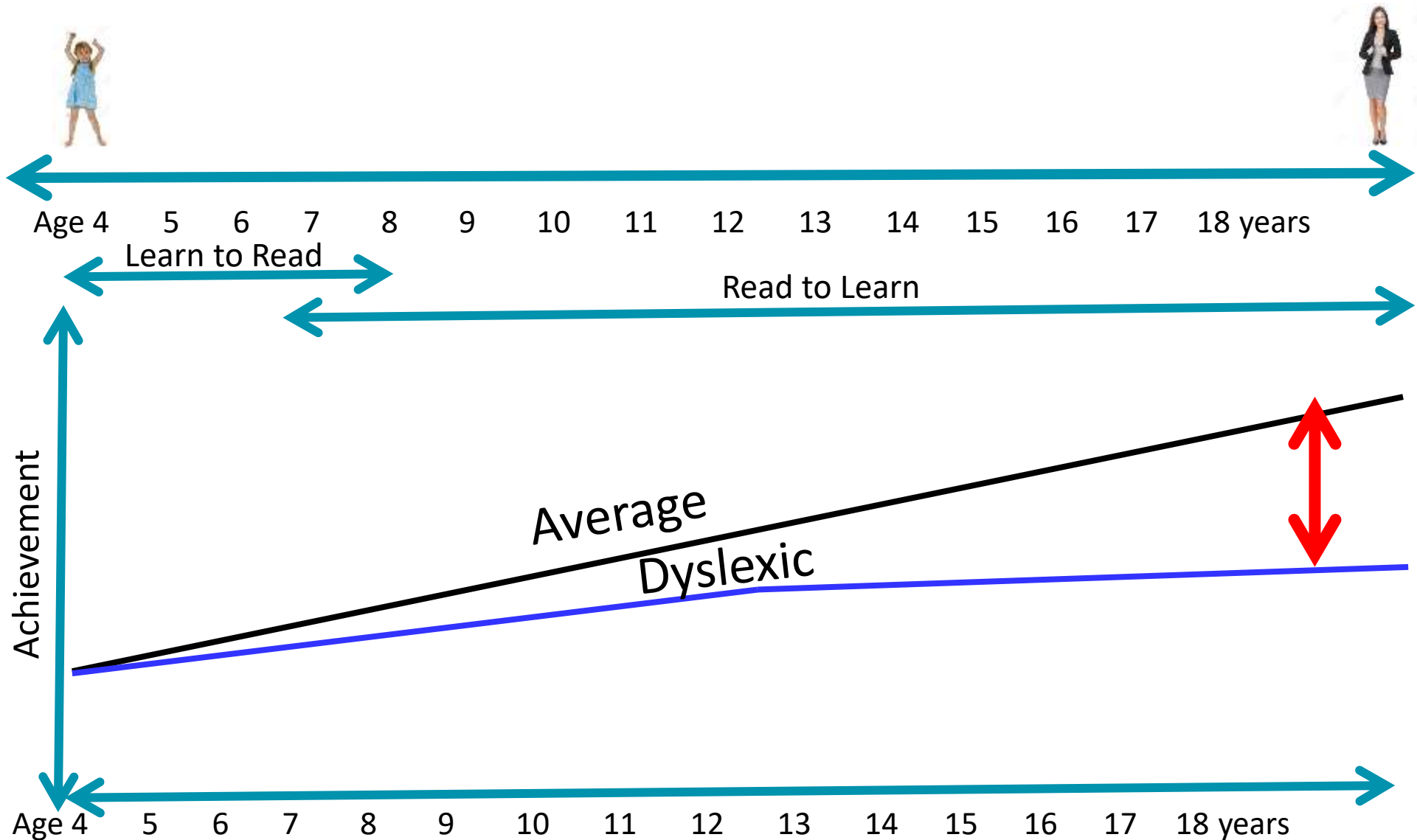

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Word Online – Immersion Reading

The Pe-ri-od-ic Ta-ble:

As you know there is a cop-y of the pe-ri-od-ic ta-ble in your prep di-a-ry. All of the known el-e-ments are lis-ted in the pe-ri-od-ic ta-ble. Each el-e-ment con-tains on-ly one type of at-om e.g. hy-dro-gen con-tains on-ly hy-dro-gen at-oms, zinc con-tains on-ly zinc at-oms etc.

Def-i-ni-tion of an el-e-ment: An el-e-ment is a sub-stance

You may ask, why aren't wa-ter or car-bon di-ox-ide in the table be-cause they are not

el-e-ments. They don't con-tain just one type of at-om. Wa-ter (H₂O) is made of two types of at-om, name-ly hy-dro-gen and ox-y-gen so wa-ter is not an el-e-ment. Car-bon di-ox-ide (CO₂) isn't made of just one type of at-om ei-ther. Car-bon di-ox-ide con-tains car-bon and ox-y-gen and so car-bon di-ox-ide is not an el-e-ment.

Touch typing

- AN Dyslexic students entering secondary school with typing as their normal way of working are at an advantage academically.
- AN Educational psychologist often recommend dyslexics learn to type.
- AN There are many good, free teach yourself typing solutions.
- AN Few dyslexic students are proficient typists.
- AN Many give up on education before they reach secondary school, wrongly believing they are stupid.

Written work

Written work is how students are marked / judged.

If poor quality a student's talent goes unrecognised.
