Working Session: The Practical Application of the Social Determinants of Health

Dr. Sally Kraft, MD, MPH is VP of Population Health at Dartmouth Hitchcock where she leads a multi-disciplinary team dedicated to improving the health of communities across the region served by Dartmouth Hitchcock faculty and affiliates. She has worked with the High Value Healthcare Collaborative on disseminating evidence-based practices in health systems across the US. Dr. Kraft served as the Medical Director of Quality, Safety and Innovation at the University of Wisconsin Health system from 2007-2014 where she led system-wide initiatives to redesign ambulatory care. She received her MD and MPH degrees from the University of Michigan, completed a residency in internal medicine at Santa Clara Valley Medical Center and fellowships in pulmonary and critical care medicine at Stanford University. She has practiced pulmonary and critical care medicine in Stanford CA and Madison WI.

- * Examine the ways that social determinants of health may be impacting these issues and crises
- * Explore and create new models that can impact behavioral health issues by using volunteerism to address relevant social determinants.
