



HUB CITY ANIMAL PROJECT AWARDS GRANTS

In its third grant cycle, Hub City Animal Project received grant requests in excess of \$55,000. With our available funds, we awarded \$35,500 to nine organizations who align with our mission to address the root cause of animal homelessness in Spartanburg. HCAP has awarded in excess of \$76,000 in our three grant cycles.

ANIMAL ALLIES Continued its “Sterilize Don’t Euthanize” project offering a subsidized co-pay spay/neuter for pets whose owners live below the poverty level.

ANIMAL SAFE HAVEN Held a cat “neuter-thon” to neuter, vaccinate, and microchip male cats at free or low cost to the owner.

CRITTER CONNECTION Funding to trap, neuter and release cats at existing or new colonies and assist with additional medical needs as necessary.

FOSTER PAWS Helped with costs associated with rescuing, fostering and rehabilitating animals by providing vaccinations, spay/neuter and other veterinary needs.

MONROE’S MIGHTY MISSION Helped Mobile Meals recipients with pets who struggle physically and financially by setting up “Spay Days” once a month. Additionally, the organization helped with transporting and subsidizing costs of veterinary care.

PAWS, PRAYERS, AND PROMISES Provided veterinary services and vaccinations for at risk animals.

PROJECT PAWWS Provided shelter services, bedding, humane restraint devices and adequate food and hydration for at-risk outside animals. The organization also provided medical care, education and spay/neuter services.

SPARTANBURG HUMANE SOCIETY Will host a heartworm clinic offering low cost testing and flea and heartworm medications to the public.

SPEAK FOR ANIMALS Funding to offer free spay/neuter and rabies/distemper vaccinations for the low income communities.
