English as Another Language Classes

Edmonton Immigrant Services Association will be hosting their English language course in Malmo school (4716 115 Street). English as Another Language (EAL) classes are delivered by instructors who are members of the Alberta Teachers as a Second Language.

EAL level 4/5 will be held from September 4th to November 22nd every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9:30am to 11:30am. EAL level 2/3 citizenship classes will be held from September 4th to November 22nd every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 1pm to 3pm. Courses are run on a notfor-profit recovery basis, with a small fee being charged: \$60 per term for permanent residents and Canadian citizens or \$100 per term for anyone holding any type of temporary visa in Canada (e.g. Temporary foreign workers and visitors)

Register in person one the first class of the semester. Please bring an immigration document which proves your living status in Canada (e.g. permanent resident card) and the registration fee in cash. Registration may be accepted after the first day of the class if the class is not full. Please go to the location and check the class availability with the ESL teacher if you miss the first day of the class to register. Malmo Plains Infrastructure Renewal Committee (IRC) Report, August 2018: By Chris Ouellette

Since assuming the helm of the IRC in August, 2017, I have been grappling with a way forward on the Malmo Hall Renewal. In April of 2017, the IRC had reached a critical juncture of finding the necessary funds for the Hall's renewal. After extensive community input and research into the community needs essential for both the revival of Malmo Hall and the future demands of a growing community (Edgeway & Michener Park Redevelopment), and estimate was made. This version came back at \$1.8M which was great than the \$850K expected. With some fine tuning by the Architect, Croy Yee, & Project Manager, Randy Darr, the estimate was revised to \$1.6M, which still left a significant funding gap of \$750K. This has left the Malmo Community League (MCL) with a major challenge to find those funds to make this vision for a rejuvenated & enhanced community hall a reality.

Recently I have reengaged former members of the IRC as well as finding new members to begin the grant applications process for funding from the City of Edmonton and the Province. In addition to government funding, a 2014 Neighbourhood Memorandum of Understanding allows MCL to have their \$200K allocated for the hall renewal matched by Westcorp for a total of \$400K. Given that the government funding is not guaranteed, the IRC is taking a multi-phased approach to the project by planning a modest expansion of the hall along with finishing, electrical service, and other functional updates that are sorely needed. The degree of funding success in the next 6-9 months will determine whether the new hall addition can go ahead in some form.

At this time there is an opening on the IRC for a professional grant writer to tackle this ambitious goal for the Malmo Plains Community League.
