



Camp Policies

All participants and parents please read and sign below.

Please retain a copy for your own reference.

1. All students are asked to dress according to our dress code. At summer camp and any other Alpha event, participants need the freedom to move around while remaining modest, so we ask the following:
- ☺ Shirts and pants must cover midriffs and backs **while in motion**. Two good ways to check this are to hold hands in the air and/or to sit on the floor; if back or midriff shows – shirt is too short or pants not high enough.
 - ☺ Shirt neck lines should be high (we don't mean turtle necks). Shirts **must** have sleeves.
 - ☺ If shorts are worn, they should be long enough to allow for movement with no undergarments showing or even the threat of undergarments showing and leg openings should not be too baggy for the same reason. As a general guide, they should not be shorter than approximately 4" from the knee cap.
 - ☺ Holes in jeans should be at or below knee level.
 - ☺ We ask that clothes not be skin tight. No leggings allowed (unless worn with dress/skirt like hose)

If clothing does not meet camp standards, a phone call may be made for appropriate clothing to be brought.

Family members, assistants and camp staff are asked to respect the guidelines in their attire at camp as well.

2. Shoes must be worn or brought that can be used for playing games and to dance. These can be sneakers or dance shoes.
3. Campers/Volunteers need to bring a bag lunch and an **unbreakable** water bottle every day. We strongly urge campers to avoid drinks high in sugar (like sodas) and high energy drinks. ALL campers are to eat together in the designated room (no wanderers).
4. **Mark all belongings** that come to camp. This includes lunch bags, water bottles, carry bags, notebooks etc.
5. Campers/Volunteers should not come to camp if they:
- ☺ Have chills or fever or have had them in the past 24 hours
 - ☺ Are vomiting or have in the past 24 hours
 - ☺ Have any other sign of contagious illness
- If someone is sick, please call the Camp Director or any other designated camp helper and let her/him know. If we are close to show time your child may still be able to participate depending on the situation.**
6. Campers/Volunteers may NOT bring any pocket knives or any type of potential weapon to camp.
7. If there are any "romantic" interests, we ask that it put it on hold while at camp and during any camp activity (including the actual performance). We can not allow any "pairing off" of boys and girls or any physical expression of such interests - camp needs to be enjoyable by all who attend and this sort of thing can make others very uncomfortable.

The areas addressed in this policy statement may seem strict but it is meant for the betterment of the overall experience for all involved. Thank you for your understanding.

I have read and understand these Camp Policies. I also understand that if these policies are not followed, participant(s) may be asked to leave or parents may be called to pick up their child from camp.
