Whereas: The positions of Secretary for On-Campus Affairs and Secretary for Off-Campus Affairs are the only Cabinet seats that have a residency requirement.

Whereas: First and second year students are generally required to live on campus, while a majority of upperclassmen live in off campus residences.

Whereas: Plenty of Miami students commute to campus daily.

Whereas: Students who live off campus have already lived at least one year on campus and have been immersed in the aspects of on-campus life.

Whereas: The current requirements effectively restrict the position by class to sophomores and upperclassmen that chose to live on campus, excluding more than half of the potential candidates.

Whereas: Senate ultimately makes the final decision on who is the most qualified person for the job.

Therefore be it resolved: The Student Senate will strike the following clause in the ASG Bylaws to formally resolve any potential future candidate issues.
