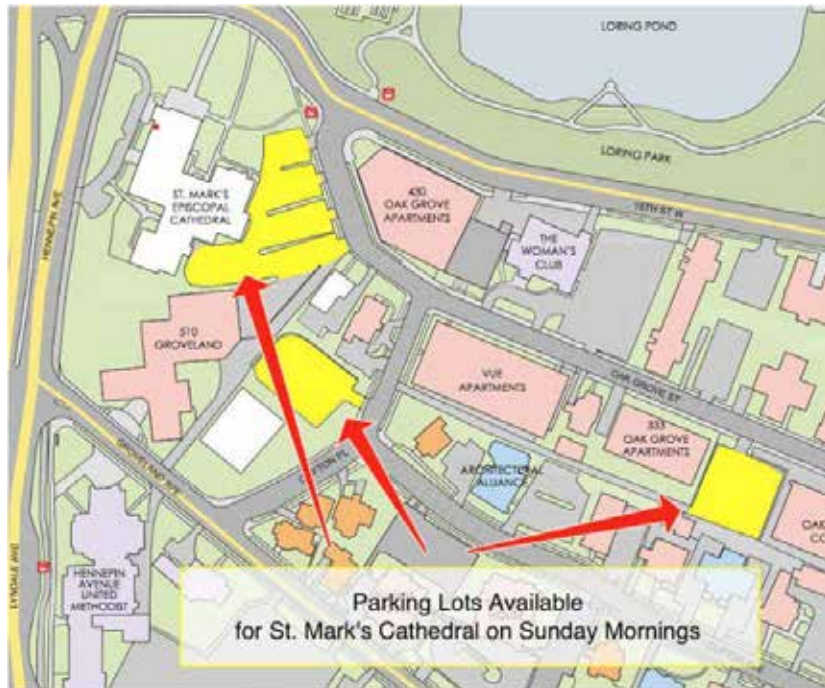
Where is St. Mark's located?

On the hill overlooking Loring Park and across Hennepin Avenue from the Walker Art Museum.

Where do I park?

There are three parking lots available on Sunday morning. The first is next to the church at the corner of 15th Street. and Oak Grove. This lot tends to fill up quickly so don't get discouraged if you don't find a spot. If you turn on Clifton Ave (after first parking lot), there is parking at the 1730 Clifton Office Building. Additionally, parking is available at the Women's Club parking lot – next to 333 Oak Grove St. There is also street parking available in the neighborhood.

How do I enter the building once I've parked?

Like any one-hundred-year-old church that was built for congregants arriving by horse and buggy, getting to the sanctuary is not exactly intuitive. The easiest way to get in is walk around to the front of the church, up the steps, and enter through the main doors into the sanctuary. Most of the other doors to the building are open on Sunday mornings, and if you enter them, simply ask someone how to get to the sanctuary.

What time is the service?

10:30 a.m. (Note: this is an hour later than our normal service time)

Is there children's programming?

Nursery care is available on Sunday mornings for children ages 3 and under. With a caring and knowledgeable team, young children are offered a safe and welcoming environment that is open on Sundays from 8 am. to 12 pm. Children over the age of 3 are invited to remain in the service.

What should I expect during the service?

"In the Episcopal Church, we consider our worship to be very formative. We have rituals that we practice each Sunday, words that we repeat week in and week out, and our worship has the same flow to it each Sunday. We believe that praying shapes believing – that how we pray shapes what we believe, so how we pray together becomes important to how we grow together.

In each pew, you will see two books – the Hymnal and the Book of Common Prayer. You can find all the music that we sing in the Hymnal; the Book of Common Prayer includes the flow of worship and words that we say as a congregation. Page numbers are given in the bulletin so that you can follow along. Part of the beauty of our liturgy is that there is mystery in it, so don't try to understand everything; try to be present to God."
