



We would like to wish y'all a very Merry Christmas and may 2017 bring you many blessings! We have so many new and exciting things happening that we can't wait to tell y'all! (That just means you'll have to look for our next newsletter update!)

I love Christmas! I love the twinkling lights, seeing all the festivities, the "snow" as it falls (or as it is here, artificially made), and the Christmas tree. The Importance of a Plan
