Love plays an important role in mental development, which frees a child to developmental skills that enhance the ability to love and grow according to God's plan.

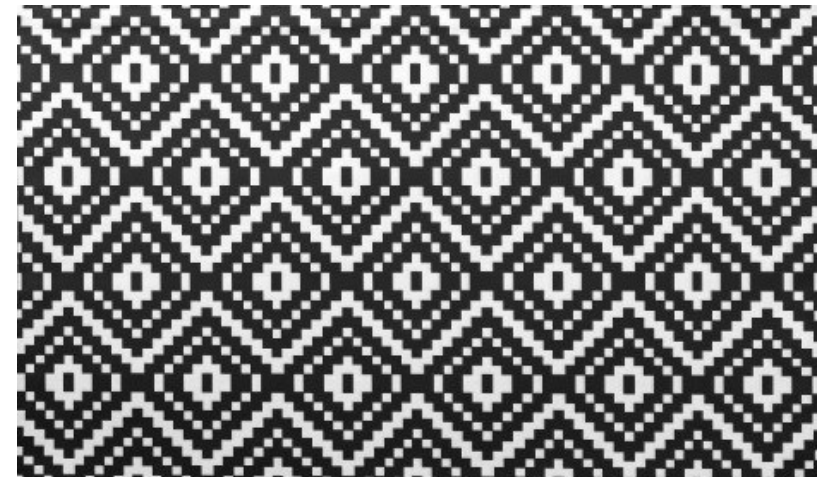

WHAT CHILDREN DO AT MOTHER'S DAY OUT

Children will develop at different rates, will talk and be listened to, sometimes interrupt, get interrupted, listen, see, feel, taste, paint, sing, build, create, wonder, move—learn by using their bodies, explore real things like sounds, tools, seeds, animals, books, music, weather, go on walks, learn where to make messes, then help clean up.

They will learn to work and play together and use words instead of hands to protect their rights and property, share the teacher's attention, equipment and materials, have time to play alone, beside a friend or with two or three friends, work out their arguments, sometimes cry and need a teacher's support, get angry and need something acceptable to do with it, gain security by relying on some routines each day, respecting others and their property and taking responsibility for materials used.

Children are exposed to new ideas such as being individual people and participating in group activities and that they are special to God and those around them.

They will play together, learn to read, play organized games, stay clean, have a good time, learn to stand in lines and take turns.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Babies: 3-11 Months

Children will experience an environment of love, trust, security, guidance and acceptance. They will participate in sensory activities, & development of gross and fine motor skills.

One's (Must Walk)

Introduction to language arts & math concepts, including name & age, colors, shapes, numbers. They will participate in simple songs and rhymes. They will begin to understand and celebrate their world based on thematic units. Physical development includes gross & fine motor skills. Emphasis placed on personal & social behavior and the introduction to spiritual concepts.

Two's

Language arts & math concepts, including name and age, colors, shapes, numbers. They will participate in simple songs and rhymes. They will begin to understand and celebrate their world through thematic units. Physical development will include gross and fine motor skills. Emphasis placed on personal & social behavior and spiritual concepts.

Three's - Pre-K

Language arts & math concepts, including name, age, birthdays, numbers and letters, address and telephone number, sequencing, colors, & shapes. They will participate in songs, rhymes, and can recall or dictate stories. They will begin to understand and celebrate their world based on the five senses and demonstrate basic concepts of complete sentences. Curriculum focus on thematic units. Physical development will include gross & fine motor skills. Emphasis placed on personal & social behavior and development of spiritual concepts.
