

OUR MISSION

In response to God's grace, we as a congregation, pledge ourselves to strive to bring all people closer to Jesus, through the *Word of God, worship, and caring service.*

The Sacrament of the Altar is the Lord Jesus Christ's precious gift to His Church with which He feeds His people with His own body and blood. A practice congruent with Scripture and the Confessions calls for the Sacrament to be shared with those who believe in the words "for you" and "for the forgiveness of sins." We therefore welcome to this table baptized Christians who are able to examine themselves and desire to eat and drink the body and blood of Jesus Christ, received under the bread and wine, of the Lord's Supper. All others are invited to come forward during the Distribution and to indicate their desire for blessing by bowing their heads. We offer Holy Communion wine from both a chalice and individual glasses. At the center of the tray, in individual glasses, we offer white non-alcoholic wine/grape juice.
