

THE IMPACT OF THE PRIMARY CARE FUNDING CLIFF



WHAT IS THE PRIMARY CARE FUNDING CLIFF?

To help cover the cost of care for millions more Americans, health centers received an additional \$11 billion from Congress in a mandatory Health Center Fund. Without action by Congress, these funds are set to expire in September 2015, which would **reduce health centers' federal funding by 60-70%**.

WHY DOES THE CLIFF MATTER?

This potential 60-70% reduction in federal funding could result in the **closure of health center sites, layoffs of providers and staff, and most importantly, a loss of access** to primary and preventive care for millions of patients who often have no other place to turn. Each and every health center would be impacted if this funding reduction occurs.

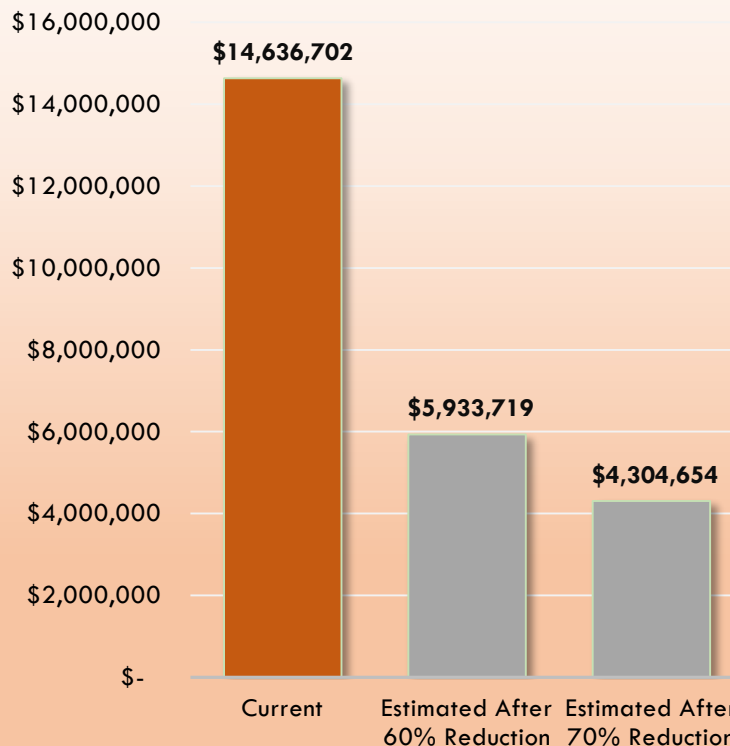

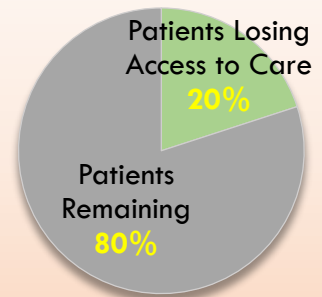
