



Rules and Regulations

Before submitting a NextGen City Jam Registration form, volunteers must read the following rules and regulations carefully and thoroughly. By submitting a NextGen City Jam registration form, ticket claimants are agreeing to all rules and regulations stipulated in this document.

Ticket Holder Eligibility

- To be eligible to receive a ticket to the NextGen City Jam, you must complete a minimum of 10 qualifying volunteer hours.
- The 10 qualifying volunteer hours must be completed between July 1 and November 15, 2017.
- Tickets are non-transferrable. Volunteer hours must be completed by the individual attending the concert.
- Volunteers who exceed 10 qualifying volunteer hours will not be given preferential treatment.
- The event will be 18+. Eligible ticket holders must be over 18 years of age.

Tracking Volunteer Hours

- All required information must be completed when submitting a NextGen City Jam Registration Form. Missing information may result in a volunteer being ineligible to receive a concert ticket.
- The first 500 volunteers to complete 10 qualifying hours and successfully submit a NextGen City Jam application form will receive correspondence explaining how they can redeem a concert ticket. Tickets will be issued on a first come first served basis.
- NextGen City Jam applications must be received by November 15, 2017. Forms submitted after this date will not be considered.

Eligible Volunteer Opportunities

- Volunteer hours must be completed at organizations with formal volunteer programs within Edmonton. Volunteer hours completed outside of Edmonton will not count towards a volunteer's 10 qualifying volunteer hours.
- 'Formal volunteer programs' are offered through established community organizations or municipalities (i.e. the City of Edmonton, Edmonton's Food Bank). Formal volunteer programs are typically managed by a Volunteer Coordinator and there are clearly defined roles and responsibilities for volunteers.
- The following volunteer opportunities do not qualify for the NextGen City Jam concert:
 - o Political activities. This includes volunteering at a political campaign office.



- o Religious activities. This includes the distribution of religious materials or assisting at a religious institution.
- o Informal volunteer activities. This includes helpful activities like offering to walk your friend's dog or to shovel your neighbour's sidewalk.
- o Volunteer opportunities outside of Edmonton. This includes volunteer opportunities in Sherwood Park, St. Albert, and rural Alberta

Banned Substances

- Outside alcohol, drugs and weapons are not permitted on the event premises. Possession of banned substances may result in a NextGen City Jam participant being prevented entry to the event.

Venue

- Ticket claimants are required to adhere to all policies stipulated by the event venue, The Needle. Violation of any venue policies may result in a participant being removed from the premises at the discretion of site management.

Assumption of Risks and Liability

- Attending the NextGen City Jam ('the event') may involve various risks, dangers and hazards. By participating in the event, a ticket claimant voluntarily accepts and assumes all such risks, dangers and hazards and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage or loss resulting therefrom. The City of Edmonton, its employees, volunteers and/or other participants are not responsible and assume no liability, either directly or indirectly, for personal injury, death, property damage or loss resulting from participation at the event.
