

MALDEN RIVER GREENWAY

For generations the Malden River was an industrial waterway walled-off to public use. The **Malden River Greenway Plan** lays out a vision that will transform the river, creating a world-class park system running through the cities of **Everett, Malden, and Medford**.

The Malden River Greenway intends to provide safe, connected and accessible paths for local residents and visitors along the Malden River.

It will establish an urban greenscape with thriving biodiversity and promote a healthy lifestyle through active design and open space programming.

The development of the Malden River Greenway will become integral to an open space network that provides a key link in the larger regional greenway system.



COMPLETE Summer 2018
New path at 295 Canal St.

IN-PROGRESS
DEP issued a Ch. 91 license condition to National Grid that they build a 10' path along the entirety of their shoreline.

COMPLETE Spring 2019
This half-mile waterfront path and 6 acre recreational open space is under construction.

IN-PROGRESS
The current landowner is initiating a redevelopment plan that includes a path and boat rental.

COMPLETE Fall 2018
Two new underpasses will connect the greenway along the river and under the bridge.

COMPLETE Summer 2019
The last phase of the Wellington Greenway is designed with permitting underway.

COMPLETE Fall 2020
The Northern Strand extension is designed with permitting underway.

COMPLETE Summer 2019
The Encore HarborWalk and HarborWalk Connector are under construction.
