#### FEBRUARY MEETING RECAP

On Wednesday, February 15, 2012 our chapter gathered for a lunch presentation by the Downtown Cleveland Alliance. Mr. Michael Deemer, who was accompanied by Mr. William Tarter, presented "The Voice of Downtown." Mr. Deemer began his presentation by acknowledging our group's connection to the built environment and proceeded to thank all those in attendance for their work on the many buildings in downtown Cleveland.

The Downtown Cleveland Alliance is a non-profit group devoted to creating a more vibrant downtown. As an eleven member staff, the group has been responsible or involved with such projects as the Cleveland Ambassador Program and the security camera program. Our Cleveland Ambassadors

add a level of security and safety beyond the increased police patrols and 32 security cameras strategically placed throughout downtown assist enforcement personnel with video updates of street corners. With over 10,000 downtown residents, the residential occupancy rate is at 96%... proving that people really do love to Live, Work and Play Downtown! The efforts of many have allowed Cleveland to invest over \$2 billion in construction. projects during the past couple of years...all during a recession! Work has included the convention center, the aquarium, the medical-mart, the EastBank project, the CoastGuard building, and 24 other office renovations. The next focus area will be the 9th-12th District. This is the area between East 9th and East 12th and

between Euclid and Lakeside. A focus on housing will continue in this area; there is even mention of converting the previously named "East Ohio Gas Building" into residential properties. A possible future focus area will be the Lakefront area, especially near Burke Lakefront Airport. Regardless of the area, the desire is to create a more "walkable city"; a Connectivity Group Plan Commission has even been established to monitor these efforts. In conclusion Mr. Deemer shared a great Cleveland promotional video. All members are encouraged to visit downtown, or possibly relocate to a downtown address! Thank you Mr. Deemer for an enlightening updated on our wonderful Downtown Cleveland

# SUNSHINE COMMITTEE



our ASHRAE Sunshine Committee continues to be grateful for not having any obituaries to write over the past several months. However, as the saying goes: "The devil finds work for idle hands" - in my case, speculation about whether ASHRAE membership may confer improved longevity. After all, only a few years ago, an ASHRAE

Fellow, Milton W. Garland, was recognized at age 103 as the oldest working American, still reviewing patents and teaching industrial refrigeration to engineering trainees, 20 hours per week at the Frick Company in Pennsylvania (now part of Johnson /Service/Controls/Refrigeration/Seats/?), for nearly 80 years, starting as a graduate engineer in 1920 at 47 cents/hour.

Google 'Milton W. Garland' to see many pages about his illustrious career. In full disclosure: my closest colleague during my Army service in the Cooling Section of Werner von Braun's Research and Development Branch at Redstone Arsenal in 1951 and 1952 was Ed Shriver, a 1950 graduate of Mr. Garland's program at Frick. (Ed went on to a long career with Westinghouse, selling the very earliest rooftop air-conditioning units to Woolworth stores. Unfortunately, Ed died before his instructor, Mr. Garland, - but then I am not sure Ed ever joined ASHRAE.)

Longevity also brings recollection of Cleveland ASHRAE traditions. For many years, our networking time before our meeting was called "Bomb Shelter".

This was a carry-over from when the local Chapter of the American Society of Refrigeration Engineers met at the old Cleveland Engineering Society building around 18th and Carnegie in downtown Cleveland. The building was a former telephone exchange, and the bar was set up in a former basement coal bin with a vaulted brick ceiling. This reminded World War II veterans of time spent in English bomb shelters, hence networking was then called "Bomb Shelter" time.



In recognition of this evident ASHRAE member longevity, I would like to propose a new Chapter Tradition. Recently, one of our most supportive and long-time members, Jim Karpinski, told me the Poles have a toast: "Sto Lot". It translates as "Hundred Years", and is a wish Poles express to each other when they meet to share a drink or celebrate a birthday. I suggest we do the same, in recognition of this apparent benefit of ASHRAE membership, as well as recognition of the rich and wide range of ethnic heritages among ASHRAE Clevelanders. I believe it is pronounced "Shtow-Lott" - but Karp will correct us if I am wrong.
