QUESTIONS YOU SHOULD BE ABLE TO ANSWER AFTER ATTENDING THIS MONTH'S ASHRAE MEETING

- 1. What efforts are being done in the region to promote green design and construction in commercial and public buildings? Are there plans in the State of Ohio to create tax initiatives, credits, and/or other incentives by the State or City Governments to promote the construction of Green Buildings?
- 2. Recent studies show that the cost for green buildings does not have to be greater, or much greater, than conventional buildings. But how are the green buildings, particularly LEED-certified buildings, performing? What data are there that show that these buildings provide economic paybacks or even greater energy efficiency than conventional buildings?
- 3. I have an existing building that's going through a significant renovation. What's the best LEED rating system to apply for, LEED for New Construction, which covers large renovations, or LEED EB, which covers operations? Which rating system investment will yield a better return?
- 4. What's the best way to approach greening multiple buildings, say for a campus or a city?
- 5. I heard there were more than 15,000 LEED accredited professionals. Why should I bother becoming one myself if it's so easy to do?
- 6. What are some of the more difficult aspects of designing a Green Building?
- 7. What are the latest advancements in the LEED Rating System and how is it better than the old version?
- 8. From a building owner's perspective, what things are you looking at to help encourage you to going "Green"? As a building owner/representative, are you willing to pay more for Green buildings and why?
- 9. The USGBC website indicates that Ohio has only 1 certified project with 45 registered projects; compare this to our neighbor, PA, who has 10 certified and 107 registered projects; Can you offer any insight into what that State is doing to create incentive for so many more Green Projects?

Bio for Elaine L. Barnes

Elaine joined the GBC in July 2004 as the new Executive Director.
