Parrotfeather Milfoil

Other common names:

Brazilian watermilfoil, thread of life



Haloragaceae, the milfoil family

Category: CONTROL



Diagnostic Characteristics

- Plant is bright green in color; has emergent leaves and stems
- Leaves are arranged in whorls of 4 to 6 around the stem with 12 to 36 leaflet pairs
- Leaves are feather-like in appearance
- Forms dense mat of rhizomes under water and in sediment

Background

- Native to South America; introduced as an escaped aquarium and ornamental plant
- Inhabits margins of canals, ponds, and rivers
- Reproduces through fragments and rhizomes
- Plant interferes with water movement and contributes to flooding problems
- Provides ideal mosquito larvae habitat
