## Atlanta's Best Restaurants Near the Beltline

The Beltline's been one of the more transformative developments for intown Atlanta in recent years. The rails-to-multiuse-trails project has connected previously distant neighborhoods and encouraged a new wave of pedestrian and cycling engagement with a city generally unfriendly to either. The **Eastside Trail** runs from Piedmont Park down through Inman Park — as the first complete part of the multiyear project, it's already a hot destination. The recently opened **Ponce City Market**, with its multiple restaurants and food stalls, even connects to the Beltline with a side entrance, while upscale food hall **Krog Street Market**'s less than a block from the Beltline. These 10 restaurants, listed from north to south, take full advantage of their proximity, and make for a great place to stop for a meal or drink when out enjoying the Beltline.
