Scripture for Next Sunday, July 23: Genesis 28:10-19, 20-22; Matthew 13:28-30, 36-43.

Cents-Ability: Consider that Cents-Ability money should come from money we save from buying less food or eating less expensively. Compare your food spending costs with what the U.S. Department of Agriculture figures families across America need to spend for food each week. For example, a family of two adults between 19-50 years spends \$88.90 per month on a thrifty food plan, \$113.80 on a low-cost plan, \$141.40 on a moderate-cost plan and \$177.10 on a liberal plan. A family of two adults over 50 will spend a bit less than that. A family of four with two elementary school-age children spends \$148.60, \$195.40, \$243.80, and \$253.40. This plan assumes that all food is eaten or prepared at home, and is well-balanced based on 2005 Dietary Guidelines and 2005 MyPyramid food intake recommendations. These costs are updated with current dollars for May 2017. The amount spent for food in each type of plan is affected by cost, by the specific foods chosen, and by the quantities of food.
