Pastor's Ponderings...

Two things are on my mind this morning as I consider what to write in this newsletter article. So it seems like a perfect opportunity to tie them together – prayer and stewardship. Strange bedfellows indeed – one is so intangible and the other so tangible. Nevertheless the stewardship of our lives, our finances, our church, etc. is very much affected by our prayer life. And it works the other way around too. Our prayer life is very much affected by the ways we view and practice stewardship in all the areas of our lives. I think it is reasonable to say that all of us could use a little help, do a little better, in our prayer lives and in our stewardship practices.

People wonder about how to pray, whether there is a “right” way to pray, or what happens in prayer. Even the apostle Paul, in the first century, confessed: “We do not know how to pray as we ought” (Romans 8:26).

The ‘keep it simple’ rule applies. Prayer is simply talking with God in all the ways we communicate with and talk to other people. However, whenever, wherever, and whatever, you choose to pray, the most important thing is to DO it! Paul sets a goal for us to “pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). In prayer we are called to recognize our total dependence on God and to realize that all that is good in our lives is a gift from God.

Over time, prayer helps us to see ourselves as God sees us and to see who God is calling us to become. With this realization comes a sense of purpose and a responsibility to the Christian practice of stewardship whereby we serve God’s kingdom in whatever ways we can. As faithful stewards we place our talents and gifts at the service of God and one another. Hugh Whelchel, Executive Director of the Institute for Faith, Work & Economics, says that Christian stewardship “is where the concepts of faith, work and economics intersect.” In other words, stewardship is a package deal not to be shirked or taken lightly.

Stewardship season is upon us. You will be hearing more information about that soon. Unashamedly, we will be asking for your financial support; and if possible, increased giving. It goes without saying that there is a need for financial resources to support our aging physical plant and administrative costs. But your donations also directly impact the mission and ministry of this congregation both within and beyond our doors.

As you consider the connection between prayer and stewardship in your life, I would ask that you focus on gratitude. The truth is that everything we have comes to us as a gift of God – every breath, every ability, every opportunity, every moment of life – all blessings not earned or deserved but freely given to us by God through grace.

Gratitude works as the gift that keeps on giving. And Christian stewardship grows out of gratitude. Daily ask “For what gifts am I grateful today?” Say “Thank you” often – to God and others. And then respond to that gratitude by putting the things God has given you to use for God’s work in the world.

Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already.

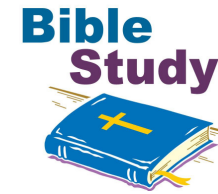
