PASTOR'S PONDERINGS ...

Advent begins this Sunday, the 3rd. I was determined to focus on the period of time only up to Thanksgiving – and then worry about the craziness and chaos to come. I pulled myself up short! Was that any way to begin to entertain the idea of any kind of Christmas spirit? But still ... is it really December 3rd already? It's time – there's no doubt. If I didn't realize it before, I realize it now as I look at the beautifully-decorated sanctuary and narthex. (That and my Christmas cactus is blooming!) Even now I can see the Christmas train barreling full-speed down the track. There are plenty of things to do, plenty of places to be and just plain 'plenty' of stresses and strains to experience here at the 'most wonderful time of the year.'

Then God pulled me up short before I could begin feeling too sorry for myself. And God spoke to me, through of all things, a radio commercial about (I think) the Christmas Show at Radio City Music Hall. Only a few of the words grabbed my attention – but those few words were enough: 'Make room for joy.' 'Make room' – don't expect to find it or to be given it. Make room! It resounded in my head. It's a challenge I want to take on. Maybe you do too. It's not easy making room for joy at Christmas-time or any other time for that matter.

As I pondered 'Make room for joy' my thoughts turned to the Christmas story: there was no room in the inn. It seemed the situation was insurmountable – the door was literally closed – there was NO room in the inn. But then that 'outside the box' moment. There was room in the stable. There is always a way to make room when master carpenter God is the room builder, the room provider. God wants us to have room to birth whatever it is we need in the moment. So 'make room' becomes a joint endeavor with God. And with God, 'all things are possible.' There is nothing that is impossible for God – not one thing!

So first, we have to make room for God. God is the source of our joy. Haven't we sung that very thing forever: 'Joy to the world! the Lord is come: Let earth receive her King; Let every heart prepare him room...' And if we can do that, joy is the divine result!

Making room for joy requires a new way of seeing things. It might take a lot of imagination. But we are made in God's image after all. Our imagination might even be stretched to make room to receive a miracle or two. And maybe our imagination will allow us to believe that with God's help we can make room for joy – a room where any wonderful, miraculous thing can happen.

So my prayer for all of you this blessed Christmas season is that you make room for God in your heart – really make a serious commitment to this holy endeavor - and may you receive an abundance of joy!




From the Worship and Music Committee

As usual, I am working with music participants (and their schedules) to make sure each ensemble is sharing their talents as often as possible. The enclosed calendar highlights activities, but here's a quick synopsis:

Chancel Choir adds to Sunday morning worship on December 3, 17 and 24. Participants gather at 9:00 a.m. Chancel Choir also adds to our 5:30pm Christmas Eve service and gathers that evening at 4:30. (Chancel Choir will not meet on Sunday, December 10, nor Sunday, December 31.)

Rehearsals and call times are in the calendar. **Chimes Ensemble** will follow the same schedule.
