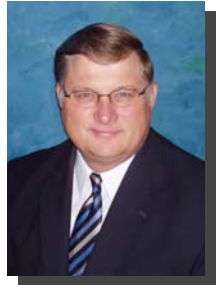

We have some eighty-five mission projects at home and around the world. There are at least that many more missionaries on deputation that need support.

This is a home for missionaries on deputation or just a place for some much needed rest. Three other missionaries will visit with us in October. Each one has a special burden to share with us. On October 9-11, **Pastor Hoyle** took **Peter Nilson** from Kenya to visit two churches. Peter is here training in our Titus Program so he can go back and teach his people. This is a good program and one that needs more support.

You can see we have a variety of missionary endeavors. The needs are so great around the world. Please pray for and financially support missions. If you want more information on world needs or needs at home, let me know. I would be happy to share needs. We are involved in helping build a wall, required by code, in Ghana. This is a good missionary, and he is asking God for \$26,000.00 to complete the wall. Would this be something you would like to help build? We can give you details and accountability of the funds.

I showed our Church Family twelve letters from missionaries that want to go to the field. They are mostly young couples, called of God and excited about going. As you read this paragraph, would you pause and pray for these missionaries and for those that are on the field? Maybe you would like to adopt a missionary? Thank God for those who still go and take the Light of the Gospel to those who remain in darkness. I would hasten to add that our own beloved America is full of darkness and needs to hear the Gospel.
